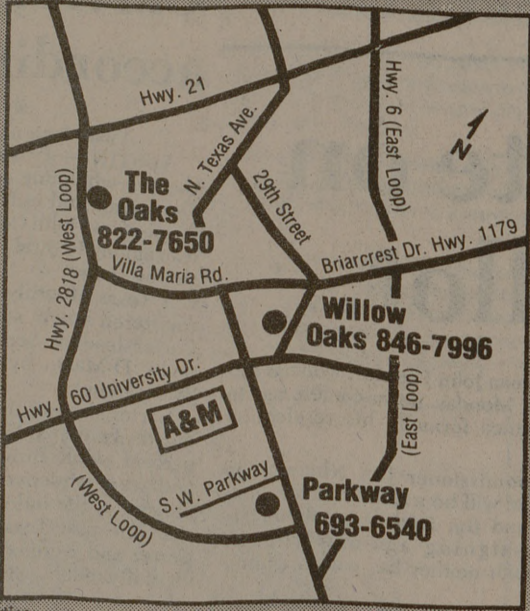

Dealers join Chrysler program

DALLAS — Chrysler Corp. officials said Tuesday 117 of their 120 dealerships in northern Texas would participate in the financially troubled company's money-back guarantee program.

Chrysler passenger car may be returned and its cost refunded except for accrued finance and interest charges. The program also provides that anyone who test drives a Chrysler product and then buys either a new Chrysler or another competitive new car within 30 days will receive \$50. Car Laux, sales and marketing vice president, said the program was

aimed at getting consumers better acquainted with Chrysler products. "We feel very strongly that we're building better cars than people really know," he said. "We're anxious to have them try them." The new program, the first of its kind in the auto industry, also will include free scheduled maintenance during the first 24 months or 24,000 miles. Also included in the program

is a free membership in the Motor Club. The program begins Thursday. Laux said officials have not decided how long it will continue. He, however, the program was designed as a "gimmick" but as a doing business. Nearly 3,800 Chrysler dealers nationwide (about 90 percent) expected to participate.

Clements against dues deductions

AUSTIN — Gov. Bill Clements said Tuesday he would do everything possible to disallow the comptroller from deducting union dues from the paychecks of state employees who request such deductions.

At a luncheon speech to the Travis County Republican Party, the governor said he disagreed with Attorney General Mark White, who on Monday ruled Comptroller Bob Bullock had the authority under state law to deduct the union dues from state paychecks.

"I am opposed to such a ruling and I have already discussed this with my staff. I will try to get immediate legislation that will put a stop to this nonsense," Clements said. "I am for our right-to-work law totally." The governor also said he was opposed to busing of school children,

but said he was convinced the problem was a federal one.

"We need to elect congressmen who will take this issue to the federal government. It is not a state issue. But I am absolutely opposed to busing."

Clements also said President Carter would be the Democratic candidate this year and said it would be tough to beat the president in Texas. "Mr. Carter will be the candidate in my judgment. He's going to be tough. He's a sitting president and we will have to work very hard to accomplish our purposes," he said.

The governor said Republicans will have to make an "absolute commitment" in order to defeat Carter and said he was confident Texas could be carried 52-48 for whom the GOP nominates.

"We're going to have to work tails off," he said.

John Henry Faulk considers Congress

DALLAS — Texas humorist John Henry Faulk, who won one of the largest libel verdicts in history for being falsely called a communist sympathizer during the 1950s, is

considering running for Congress. Faulk, who lives in Madison, Wis., and is a regular on the television series "Hee Haw," said, "There's some question as to which one I'd like to run for — 'Hee Haw' or the congress."

Faulk said friends have been urging him to run in the Democratic primary for the East Texas House seat now occupied by Rep. Charlie Wilson of Lufkin.

"Charlie Wilson has done such a poor job of representing this district," he said. "He spends all his time running that honky-tonk there."

Faulk's "honky-tonk" statement referred to a restaurant-bar in Washington, D.C., that Wilson owned until recently.

Faulk was a radio humorist whose career was almost ruined during the anti-communist fervor of the 1950s. His libel verdict helped end the practice of "blacklisting" alleged communists.

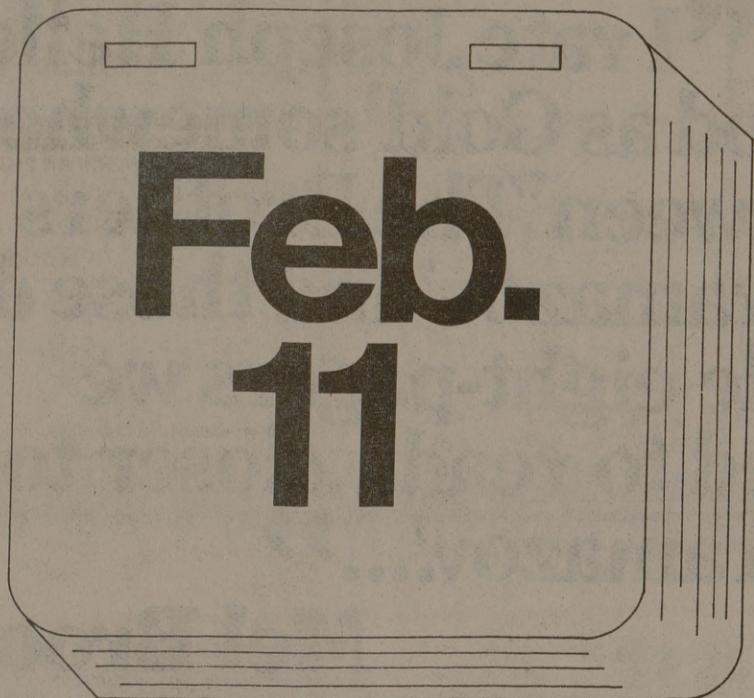

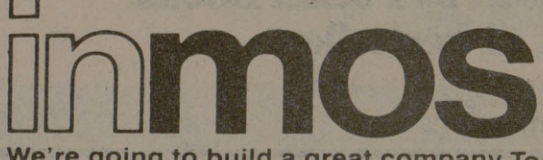

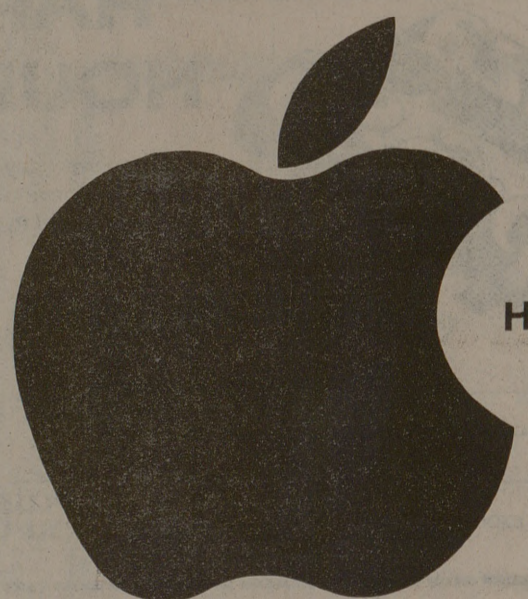
