If you are enrolled in or have been accepted for admission to study Medicine/Osteopathy or Optometry, you may be eligible for a United States Navy Health Professions Scholarship. Friends remember Durante

SANTA MONICA, Calif. — Friends of the late Jimmy Durante remember him as a "beautiful guy."

"Jimmy Durante was a beautiful human being," Lucille Ball said of the comedian who died Tuesday at St. John's Hospital of a lung ailment. He was 86. Durante will be buried Friday at Holy Cross Cemetery. Danny Thomas will conduct a remembrance after the mass.

In lieu of flowers, Durante's family asked donations be made to the Jimmy Durante Children's Fund of Beverly Hills.

The list of honorary pallbearers reads like a who's who of Hollywood: Desi Arnaz, Sr., Milton Berle, Joey Bishop, Ray Bolger, Ernest Borgnine, George Burns, Jimmy Cagney, Rory Calhoun, Dennis Day, Sammy Fain, Bob Hope, Harry James, George Jessel, Peter Lawford, Jerry Lewis, Dean Martin, Robert Mitchum, Donald O'Connor, George Raft, Don Rickles, Frank Sinatra, Red Skelton and others.

The man the world knew as "Schnozzola" didn't seem to have an enemy.

"The world lost a great friend when Jimmy Durante breathed his final 'Inka Dinka Doo,'" Sinatra said. "He came to my aid when I was just a kid with stars in my eyes, just as he came to the aid of a world looking for laughs and songs and entertainment all during his lifetime."

Jackie Gleason added, "I worked with Jimmy and I was a great admirer of his and I'm very sad at his passing."

"He was a doll," said Milton Berle. "There wasn't a bad bone in that man's body. I will never forget his 75th birthday. At his party we rigged a breakaway piano that fell into a thousand pieces when he sat down to the keyboard. Jimmy laughed harder than anyone else."

George Burns said he remembers Durante as "a very funny, warm

man." "He was a nice human being... the kind you always wanted to hug," he said.

Durante is survived by his second wife, Margaret, and their adopted daughter, Cecille.

He liked to keep an air of mystery about his famous ending, "Good night, Mrs. Calabash, wherever you are," but once explained it was a reference to his first wife, Maud Malone Olson, who died in 1943.
