Parents award search begins

Students wanting to nominate their parents for the University's Parents of the Year award can pick up applications today through Feb. 15 in the student government office at the Memorial Student Center.

The award each year honors a student's parents who have made contributions both to their community and to Texas A&M University. The award, formerly given to the Texas A&M Mother of the Year, has been made since the 1920s.

Mike Weaver, chairman of the Parents' Day Committee, said parents will be chosen on the basis of their community involvement through friends, churches, business associations and any contribution they have made to the University.

Applications are due Feb. 29, and should be accompanied by three or more letters of recommendation and an explanation of why the student feels his parents should be Parents of the Year.

The 13-member committee will judge the applications and the winner will be recognized during the Parents' Day ceremonies April 20. Last year about 30 applications were turned in.

"I definitely would like to see more participation from students this year," Weaver said. "It's a big honor to be Parents of the Year."

Senior James Kubecka, a son of last year's Parents of the Year, Mr. and Mrs. Oswald Kubecka, said his parents got the award because of the way they raised their family and came to support any of their sons' events.

"They are here for every home football game and more times than not are in the spirit line with us," Kubecka said. "It's not been easy for them to always drop what they're doing and come be with us but it has

meant a lot to us and to our friends who can share in the visits."

Kubecka said not only do his parents come to every football game they come to Corps marches and their Day, and have eaten with several times in Duncan Hall.

"They have taught me about living along in life," he said. "It's not necessarily just about hard work of what it is that we must expect ourselves. They have made it so size how important our attitudes are."

Of the 11 Kubecka sons, 10 attended Texas A&M. With the exception of a gap in 1972, Kubeckas have been here at Texas A&M since 1960, when the oldest came on a football scholarship.

Weaver said the winning parents each receive a Texas A&M plaque with a "Parents of the Year" inscription.

"They also receive a small remembrance of the event, a tie clip for the father and a pin for the mother which are also A&M crest — besides the recognition of being parents of the year."

Moore seeks Senate again

AUSTIN — Sen. William Moore, D-Bryan, has announced he will seek re-election.

Moore, the Senate dean who has not faced opposition since 1966, being challenged this year in Democratic primary by former Bryan Municipal Court Judge J. Caperton.
