Few A&M Hispanics feel prejudice

Only 16.1 percent of the Texas A&M University's Mexican-

American students feel they are discriminated against, according to an inter-departmental study done by Ben Aguirre, assistant professor of Sociology.

The study, however, was based on a small number of responses to a questionnaire sent out to the over 1,000 students found in the 1977-78 Student Directory with Spanish surnames.

The low response, said Aguirre, is due to the many ways students identify themselves. Some students with Spanish surnames are either foreign students or Americans of Mexican-American descent who do not consider themselves Mexican-Americans.

Most of the students reporting discrimination said they had not been discriminated against on the Texas A&M campus as much as by the general public and personnel in stores and restaurants in the Bryan-College Station area. The students reported feelings of social inadequacy in situations such as being asked or invited to another to dance at a night club.

"These places (the social establishments) portray the standard attitude of how Mexicans should be treated in Texas," Aguirre said. "One would think of Texas A&M in a common setting."

One student was critical of the quality of social life for minorities at the University.

"Being from San Antonio, I am accustomed to many types of Mexican-American events," the student said. "It has been quite a shock coming to Texas A&M because of the lack of entertainment for Mexican-Americans."
