Lentz said the company had received the violation notice, which could mean and fine of \$50 to \$1,000. Lentz also said Stauffer will pay the reasonable medical expenses of persons exposed to the gas.

There are no long-term health effects, but it certainly was a considerable irritant to those people who smelled it last night," Lentz said. "We are concerned to the extent

that we certainly don't want it to happen again. That particular unit, which makes sulfuric acid, is still shut down and will not be restarted until we're positive we can control it properly," he said.

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
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


