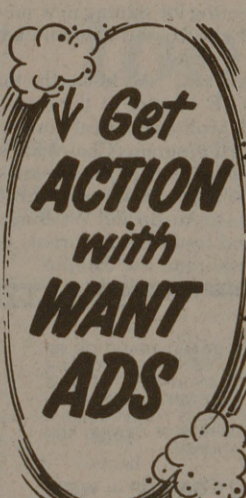

# Fresh Soviet troops flown into Afghanistan

United Press International Soviet-backed Afghan forces reportedly have been using air strikes and artillery to counter fierce rebel resistance in eastern Afghanistan. In apparent preparation for a major military operation, hundreds of fresh Soviet troops are being flown into the Afghan capital of Kabul and Afghan units are being reinforced with Russian soldiers, The Times of London reported Thursday in a dispatch from Kabul. In Washington, a State Department source Thursday could only confirm "there are preparations for what they would call counter-guerrilla activity."

A U.S. intelligence official said Tuesday reports reaching the West indicated Soviet troops were looting in Kabul and setting fires to screen their activities.

Estimates of the numbers of Soviet troops in Afghanistan have been increased from 87,000 to 90,000. Diplomats in neighboring Pakistan said Wednesday fighter planes of the Soviet-backed Babrak Karmal regime have been bombarding Kama, a small town on the banks of the Kunar River 96 miles east of Kabul, since Sunday.

Soviet-made artillery began pounding the area the following day, said the diplomats, who generally discount rebel accounts of fighting inside Afghanistan.

The fighting in the area about 25 miles from the border with Pakistan began after 250 Afghan troops de-

fected to the rebel side and seized control of the surrounding district, a guerrilla leader in the Pakistan frontier town of Peshawar said.

The defecting troops brought rocket launchers and anti-aircraft guns with them and rebel leader Mangal Hussain said the weapons gave the insurgents enough fire power to keep armored units from crossing the Kunar River.

Public unrest against Afghan and Soviet forces was said to be growing because food supplies to cities are being cut by severe winter weather and by landslides caused by rebel sabotage, the intelligence official in Washington said.

In a Kabul Radio broadcast, an Afghan Foreign Ministry spokesman said U.S. plans to give aid to Pakistan show that "America wishes to turn Pakistan into an arsenal."

There have been a number of re-

ports the Soviets want to take Karmal and The Times said Thursday plans for "a peaceful transfer of power" were under way.

In the southeastern city of Kandahar, shopkeepers Wednesday continued a general strike despite recent intimidation from MIG-17 fighters buzzing the city and the presence of troops and tanks in the street, witnesses said.

In Islamabad, Pakistan President Mohammad Zia ul-Haq Wednesday said his country and India, long-time enemies, were considering a diplomatic initiative to convince Soviets to withdraw from Afghanistan.

In Tokyo, a Foreign Ministry spokesman Wednesday night said the United States has proposed foreign minister's meeting of Western industrial powers for consultations on the Afghanistan crisis.

# Report says deal near for hostages

United Press International The United States and Iran are nearing a "face-saving" agreement that would lead to freeing the 50 American hostages from the U.S. Embassy in Tehran, a Kuwaiti newspaper said Thursday.

The first step toward a settlement will be the establishment of an international commission to look into the crimes of the ousted shah," the newspaper Al Anba said. "Once the commission finishes its report, the hostages will be handed over to U.N. Secretary General Kurt Waldheim and the United States will lift its sanctions against Iran."

In Washington, Deputy Secretary of State Warren Christopher said he could not confirm the Kuwaiti report.

Christopher told the NBC Today program: "No, I wouldn't say there's a deal in the making. I'd say we have a somewhat promising situation and we're working hard on it as we have been for the last 96 days."

"We have hopes but I wouldn't want to create false expectations for the families of the hostages and the American people."

Iran's Foreign Ministry, reached by telephone from London, confirmed that Information Minister Nasser Minachi, jailed Wednesday, was freed from custody early

Thursday.

Minachi's release followed President Abolhassan Bani-Sadr's confrontation with the military whose charges against Minachi led to his arrest. The president accused militants of acting like "children who don't know what they are doing."

The Kuwaiti newspaper said the agreement between Iran and the United States is possible now that Bani-Sadr has assumed his duties. The newspaper gave no source for its report, but said: "The United States and Iran are working on the final touches of a face-saving agreement which will not be embarrassing for both sides."

Bani-Sadr denounced the militants Wednesday for their role in jailing of Minachi, whom the charged had CIA connections. The powerful ruling Revolutionary Council responded by ordering Minachi's immediate release.

"The militants denied Thursday they had anything to do with the arrest of Minachi. They have never interfered with nor would they ever interfere "in the executive affairs of the country and they reject the allegation that they interfere in government affairs," Tehran Radio said.

The radio said the militants had given the prosecutor's office documents from the U.S. Embassy relating to Minachi.

# Shah's status in Panama subject of contradictions

United Press International PANAMA CITY, Panama — Panama's foreign minister says the deposed shah of Iran cannot leave Panama and that he is living in the country "as if it were a jail," but the Panamanian president said the exiled monarch is free to leave under certain conditions.

The statements by Foreign Minister Carlos Ozores and President Aristides Royo in separate television interviews Wednesday were the latest in a series of confusing statements issued by Panamanian authorities on the status of Shah Mohammed Reza Pahlavi.

Asked by ABC-TV whether the shah was free to leave his home in exile in Panama, Royo said, "Yes, under the requirements of our security authorities, of course."

When he was asked if he could leave immediately, he said, "Yes, he can go if he wants to go."

"The shah cannot leave Panama

for obvious reasons," Ozores said. "He can move around inside the national territory, but he is constantly guarded and watched by the Panamanian national guard."

"He lives in the country as if it were a jail, if you can call our country a jail."

Mark Morse, spokesman for the shah, speaking by telephone from the shah's home on Contadora Island, 32 miles southwest of Panama City, said the monarch had not been told by authorities that he may leave Panama.

"No one has communicated to anything about the shah being detained or that he is not free to leave the country at any time," Morse said.

"The president (Royo) and General (Omar) Torrijos (commander in chief of the national guard) told us the shah could leave the country any time he wanted to and we have to assume that is still the same, unless there is a change of ideas or status."
