role of a person in an actual event. No boards are used and the idea is to predict what your challenger will do and try to out-think him," Westover

The role-playing games include

"Say, that's bigger than the one I caught a couple of years ago, and I hold the lake record."

Jimmy Kimbell eyeballed the stranger, and then took another look at the black bass swimming around in the livewell of his boat. Well, it was

pretty big, he decided. Ah, what the heck. He headed back to the dock at Lake Monticello. There was a little bait shop down the road where he had weighed fish before.


