Energy group will present program

Earth-sheltered housing will be the topic of a Tuesday night energy conservation program seminar.

The Texas Energy Extension Service, in conjunction with A&M's consolidated Community Education will present the second of two seminars at 7:30 p.m. in the junior school cafeteria. The seminar is open to any interested person.

Dr. Dale Webb, Texas A&M associate professor of engineering, will speak on the use of natural materials and construction methods in building.

Webb, a civil engineer, will explain various methods of incorporating the earth in the construction of energy efficient housing.

Webb said we often waste material and energy resources in designing and constructing buildings which insulate us almost completely from the earth.

"The earth itself maintains almost constant 70 degrees," he explained. "Why not build houses which take advantage of this? Otherwise, we have to re-create that temperature with air-conditioning and heating. This uses more energy."

Webb said we can cut energy expenses by incorporating a better understanding of the earth and "little logic" into the way we build things.

Some of the ideas Webb will present involve the use of dirt, near the walls of houses, to insulate against heat and cold and direct the flow of wind. He will discuss building floors below ground level to take advantage of the heat of the earth.

Some of Webb's ideas are also being used in the construction industry, and should prove helpful to those interested in building an energy efficient home.

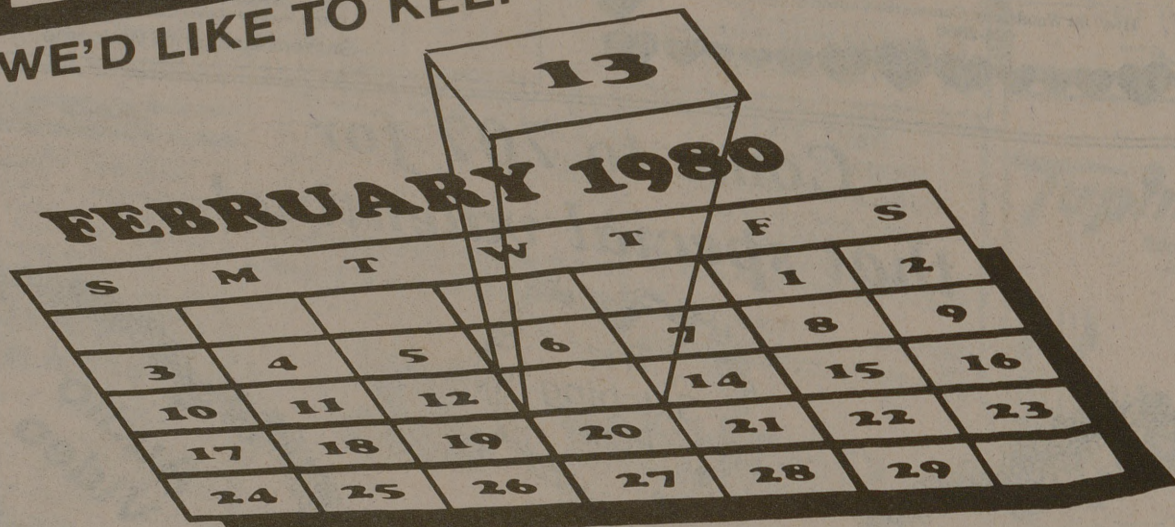
