

A nutrient that travels some 186,000 miles a second from a source 93 million miles away rates right up there with food, water, and air — as part of the life support system on earth.  
It is light. From planet earth's heater and illuminator, the sun.  
But it also comes from incandescent bulbs, two kinds of fluorescent tubes, sodium vapor and mercury vapor lamps.  
Like food, water and air, these days light's got problems.  
There is light pollution — too much of the wrong kind might cause biorhythms to zig when they should zag, make kids upset in school, reduce production among factory workers, give office workers the blahs.  
Too much sunlight causes sunburn and over the years can set the scene for skin cancer.  
There is mal-illumination. Not enough of the right kinds of light, as some scientific studies have documented, can interfere with calcium absorption in the elderly and contribute to brittle bones.  
Light also is life-saving therapy, getting jaundice in the newborn under control.  
Light, the right kind versus the wrong kind, too much versus too little, in fact, can even affect barnyard doings. Cattle kept longer than normal under artificial light imitating the best rays from the sun are 10 to 15 percent beefier than regular ones — without stuffing themselves on ex-

tra viatuals.  
There's a two-way pitch to that finding: it's a cheaper way to heavier cattle, or it presents a new theory about obesity among humanoids. Maybe all those plump Americans who say they eat like birds and still can't lose weight are just under artificial light too long.  
Well, say you. Light is light, so what's the problem.  
Wrong.  
All light isn't the same. And that's the problem.  
The kind believed to be a super nutrient is the full spectrum type coming from sunlight. Or full spectrum artificial light produced by some fluorescent lights and imitating sunlight.  
Most fluorescent lights in offices, factories, schools, colleges, hospitals do not fill that bill. They are far from full spectrum. That is what may be contributing to mal-illumination, say photobiologists on the frontier of the light revolution — going on quietly for several decades but emerging as an exciting area only about a decade ago.  
Some photobiologists consulted in preparation of this report said you couldn't get doctors to place much credence in all this until about five years ago. The American Society of Photobiology, to give an idea of the embryonic stage of the science, was only founded eight years ago.  
Illumination comes in many types. First there's sunlight, natural daylight. Next, candlelight, firelight. After that, incandescent bulbs, which use electricity to heat high resistance tungsten filaments that glow.  
A parade of light also includes fluorescent of the full spectrum type and imitating sunlight, regular fluorescent, mercury vapor, sodium vapor.

One way of rating light is by its rendering index, CRI. A standard door light has a CRI of 50. A cool white fluorescent, 50 fluorescent, 56.  
Under natural light or a source duplicating it, there's fatigue, less stress, better acuity, increased productivity, dies have shown this.  
Scientific reports credit the magic things to rays from fluorescent lights. Good rays from sunlight. Consider:  
— Plants grown under lighting that comes close to full spectrum sunlight are made to flower on preset schedules by controlling day length.  
— Down on the farm, the length of light exposure natural 9 to 12 hours of light hours of fluorescent light of spectrum type increased yield by 10 to 15 percent.  
— Full spectrum light treats psoriasis, neonatal jaundice, herpes simplex infections.  
— Rays from sunlight to the pineal gland, a pea-sized gland in the head. This gland secretes melatonin, a hormone that seems to control a lot of things. When melatonin is secreted, it inhibits ovulation and the secretion of other hormones. Experts say plastic glasses or contact lenses block out the ultraviolet rays that get through the eye to the pineal gland.  
— At the Center for Improvement of Undergraduate Education at Cornell University, Ithaca, N.Y., students working in a class fitted with fluorescent light tubes showed a significant increase in visual acuity, a reduction in overall fatigue compared to performance under fluorescent lights.  
John Ott, of Sarasota, Fla., pioneer in light and health research and selected physicist interviewed in preparation of this report has been trying to blow the doors off unhealthy effects of some light for 50 years. At first he was rebuffed. There's support now, basic research showing he was right track.
