Ellenberger and Whisenant with four counts of mail fraud in what Thompson said was a scheme to en-sure the eligibility of former player Andre Logan. Ellenberger also was charged with

Thompson said the Logan case involved a scheme to defraud UNM, the Western Athletic Conference Logan played for New Mexico in the 1978-1979 season but was de-clared ineligible with the other play-

ers early this season. In the Gilbert case, the indict-ment alleged Goldstein prepared "a counterfeit and spurious transcript from Mercer Community College, when in fact Craig Gilbert had never attended Mercer."

## Knicks win for first time in San Antonio, 128-124

United Press International SAN ANTONIO — Toby Knight and Bill Cartwright combined for 62 points as New York slipped by San Antonio, 128-124, in NBA action Thursday night.

The victory was the first ever for the Knicks in San Antonio, and it dropped San Antonio into third place in the central division, a half game behind the Houston Rockets. The Rockets were 122-117 victors over the Knicks Wednesday.

Knight hit 16 of 21 field goal attempts and finished with game highs of 32 points and nine re-

bounds. The Knicks' front line of Knight, center Cartwright (13 of 20) and forward Joe Meriweather (8 of 10) com-bined to hit 37 of 51 from the floor. Knight's 15-foot jumper with 1:50 remaining tied the game at 122-122.

The Knicks took advantage of poor defensive strategy by the Spurs to put the final points on the board.

Meriweather twice refused layups to run the clock down, and Cart-wright hit a 15-footer with 10 seconds remaining to provide the four-point victory margin.
