# Center voted down by CS city council

A proposed shopping center to be built at the corner of Highway 30 and Dartmouth Street was rejected by the College Station City Council Thursday night by a 5-2 vote.

The project was voted down after Clinton Phillips and Linda Smith, both city residents, pointed out acceptance of the project would lead to increased stop-and-go traffic in the area.

During the one-and-one-half hour discussion of the ordinance, engineer Jerry Bishop, who helped design the proposed center, said denying the project would not solve the Highway 30 traffic problem.

Councilman James Dozier said there is no need for such a project because of nearby Woodstone and Culpepper shopping centers.

Dozier also said passing the ordinance could lead to acceptance of future commercial projects in the presently vacant area since it would be discriminatory to reject some and accept others.

The council also passed a resolution which will allow the city and the A&M Consolidated Independent

School District to hold joint elections in the future.

A representative of the College Station Soccer Club asked the council to consider the parking problem at the park located at the corner of Anderson and Holleman when the 700-member club meets there Saturday mornings this spring.

Because both streets have designated bicycle lanes, the city can not allow vehicles to parallel park there, he said.

## Mobil Oil fined \$500,000 for ignoring gas regulations

WASHINGTON — A federal judge Thursday fined the Mobil Oil Co. \$500,000 after Mobil pled "no contest" to charges of circumventing federal pricing and allocation regulations in the sale of natural gas drilled in Texas.

The case marked the first time one of the nation's seven largest oil companies has been prosecuted for violating the 1938 Natural Gas Act since the Justice Department launched a price manipulations probe two years ago.




