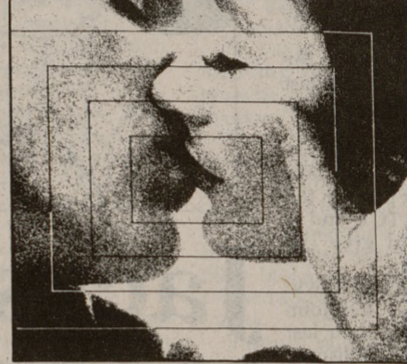
The newspaper reported Sunday that the 17- and 20-year-old men defied warnings of scientists not to observe the eclipse with the naked eye.

Prisoners release hostage; exchange for radio and food

MONTREAL — Two prisoners, freed with handmade icepicks today, freed one of three penitentiary employees taken hostage in a prison security federal prison center, the center's director said.

"They're not the type that we consider really dangerous because they have given us one of the hostages," Langelier said.

Director Gaston Langelier said re-education officer Alain Gregoire, was released unharmed eight days after he was seized late Sunday in exchange for a radio and sandwiches. Langelier said the two convicts submitted additional demands for gum for the other two hostages, brood Delisle and Leon Rivard. One of their demands was they not want to be locked in their cell when other prisoners went to the gymnasium for films," Langelier said.
