Women's tennis team plays over weekend

The Texas A&M University women's tennis team lost two out of three dual matches last weekend in round-robin play at Louisiana State University at Baton Rouge.

The Aggie team defeated the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga 5-4, lost a close match against the University of Alabama 4-5, and fell to LSU 1-8.

Texas A&M's top doubles team, Maylyn Hooten and Terri Neutze, was undefeated in the matches. They beat Tennessee 7-6, 6-2, Alabama 7-6, 6-0 and had the Aggies' only victory against LSU winning 6-2, 7-5.

Hooten, who usually plays the number one position for the team, was the outstanding Texas A&M player, winning five of her six matches.

The number three doubles team of Kathleen Sissom and Lilianna Fernandez played the deciding match against Alabama. They split sets before losing the tie-breaker 5-4 in the third set.

"On the whole they (the team) played really well," said Hollis Hands, coach of the women's team. "Except in the LSU match. I know we could have done better there. But LSU does have a good team."

Hands said that while everyone played well in the tournament, Hooten and Neutze "were the ones that really played on top of their game the whole time."

Wednesday the team's top six players will leave for Florida. They are playing Thursday through Saturday in a tournament at the University of Florida in Tallahassee.

Tennis team wins all three matches

The Texas A&M men's tennis team completed a successful road trip this weekend, winning all three of its matches despite the loss of its top player.

The team travelled to Beaumont Friday, where the Aggies beat Lamar University, 6-3. On Saturday, they beat LSU in Baton Rouge by a score of 5-4. Sunday they played Southeast Louisiana in Lafayette, and won that one by a 9-0 score.

Trey Schutz, the Aggies' number one player, was sick and couldn't make the trip.

Tempers flared over a line call LSU's Mike Oransky made in the

second set of his singles match against Aggie Reid Freeman in a tie-breaker match Saturday. Freeman protested the call, drawing heated words from Oransky. In the third set, Oransky started yelling at some members of the Aggie women's team who had been heckling him. Freeman then rushed to the court and commanded Oransky for the flouting. Freeman won the match.

The Ags upped their record to 7-0 on the season. Their next match is against Louisiana Tech in College Station on Wednesday. Play starts at 1:30 p.m. and admission is free.

Mustangs, Tech, UH win in SWC tourney openers

The saga of Sonny Allen, it seems, will continue a little while longer.

Allen, under pressure all season long at Southern Methodist, resigned as the Mustangs' coach Friday.

His players, including son Billy, wanted to give Allen a win in his last game in Dallas Monday night and they knocked off the Baylor Bears in the opening round of the Southwest Conference postseason tournament, 86-83.

SMU will be joined in the San Antonio phase of the tournament by Monday night's other first-round

winners—the Texas Tech Red Raiders and Houston Cougars.

The Raiders opened up with a streak in the second half to run away from TCU, 71-52, and Houston beat the Rice Owls, 92-80.

Houston will meet the Texas Longhorns in the opening game of Thursday night doubleheader at the Antonio's HemisFair Arena and SMU will take on Texas Tech in the second game that evening.

Then, on Friday, regular season champion Texas A&M will meet the SMU-Texas Tech winner and Arkansas will face the Texas-Houston survivor. The championship game will be for Saturday night, the winner of one receiving an automatic invitation to the NCAA tournament.

Five cagers earn All-SWC honors

DALLAS — Texas A&M University placed all five of its starting basketball lineup on the UPI All-Southwest Conference team announced today.

The All-SWC picks included junior Rynn Wright as a first-team forward, center Rudy Woods and forward Vernon Smith on the second team, and guards David Britton and Dave Goff on the honorable mention list.

Terry Teagle, the jumping jack sophomore from Baylor who led the Southwest Conference in scoring, was the only unanimous selection to the team.

Wright and Teagle were joined on the first team by Texas' Ron Baxter and Arkansas' Scott Hastings and U.S. Reed.

The second team was highlighted by Smith and Woods, Rice sophomore Ricky Pierce, Billy Allen of SMU and freshman sensation Rob Williams of Houston.

Six of the nine SWC coaches received ballots in coach of the year voting, but Arkansas' Eddie Sutton, whose team finished a game out of first place in what was supposed to be a rebuilding year, outpolled Rice's Mike Schuler for the honor.
