The Rev. Sebastian Mulder, an aide to the bishop, said Arron's wife called Zichem Wednesday and asked him to negotiate the conditions of Arron's surrender.

A long-standing dispute between the government and the union, representing soldiers in Surinam's 1,000-man army, led to the coup by soldiers who have sought better pay. The military blamed "arrogance and hate" in the government, which it said had refused to consider union

Anti-Soviet demonstrators executed in Kabul streets

United Press International Soviet-backed Afghan troops herded more than 1,000 people together in the Afghan capital of Kabul and machine-gunned them to death in a mass execution to retaliate for a weekend of anti-Soviet rioting, travelers from

Afghanistan reported Thursday.
Afghan soldiers backed by Soviet troops swept through Kabul after the weekend's disturbances and arrested an estimated 5,000 people, the travelers said on arrival in Peshawar, Pakistan, near the Afghan border.

One of the travelers was asked if minority Shiite Moslems who were blamed for last week's riots were the main victims of the retribution, but he said there was no apparent singling out of one

Other sources have said, however, that the the Sovietbacked authorities have focused their retaliation on Shiite groups which represent 20 percent of Afghanistan's 15 million people.
