WASHINGTON — House
Democratic leader Jim Wright said
Thursday the House will approve the
money requested by President Carter for draft registration of young men despite a setback in an appropriations subcommittee

'We are determined that the pres-

ident shall not be denied or embar-rassed," Wright told reporters.

The subcommittee Wednesday refused to approve funds for a registration program that would begin prior to a mobilization order by the president. The panel agreed only to provide enough money for a standby

registration system.
Wright called the subcommittee's vote "unrepresentative" of the feeling in the full committee and in the

"I have every confidence that funding for registering males will be approved next week by the full appropriations committee," the Texas Democrat said.

Refusing the president's request would give the Soviet Union a "false impression that the United States is vacillating and undecided," he said.

"I personally regret the unrepre-sentative action that occurred yesterday (Wednesday) in the subcomsaid Wright. "I feel very strongly that it will be effectively re-




