

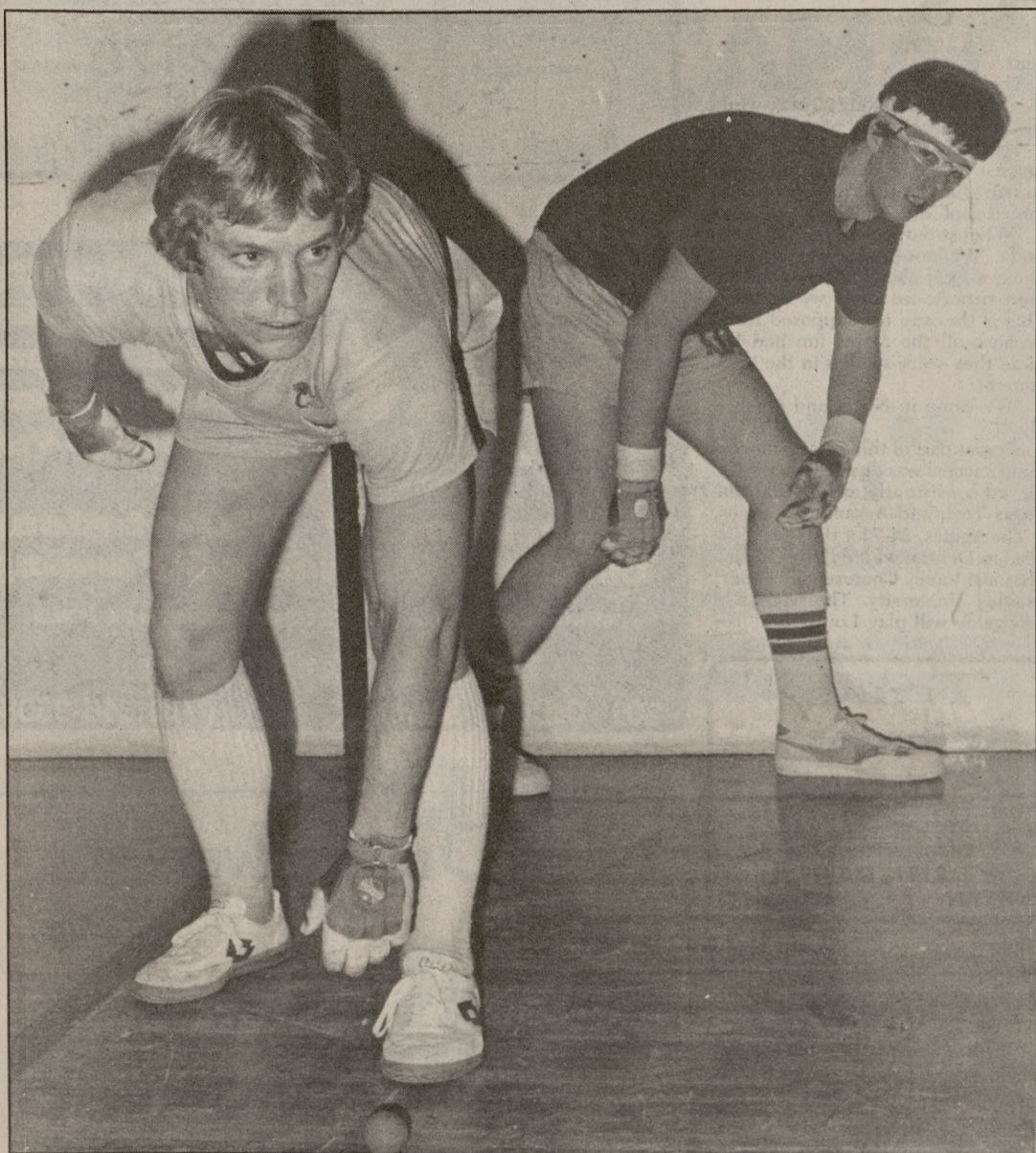

The Texas A&M Badminton Club competed in the Baylor Badminton Tournament in January. The following were winners in the college division: Consolation-Women's Singles: Pat Fierro; Consolation-Women's Doubles: Pat Fierro; Consolation-Mixed Doubles: Pat Fierro and Eric Hunter.

In the Men's Singles B Division, first place was taken by Eric Hunter and second place by Bill Connatser. Hunter and Connatser then teamed together to win consolation Men's B Doubles. Tony Grice won first place in the Men's Doubles A Division and second place in the Mixed Doubles A Division. Also competing from A&M were Soeii Bong and Ricardo Hoegg.

The Badminton Club then traveled to Corpus Christi for the Del Mar College Tournament. Raheela Rasheed won Consolation Ladies Singles in the college division while Bill Connatser and Rita Parish (CCSU) won first in the mixed doubles. Others competing from A&M were James Welford, Alan Johnson, Doug Repping, Helena Boves, and Eric Hunter.

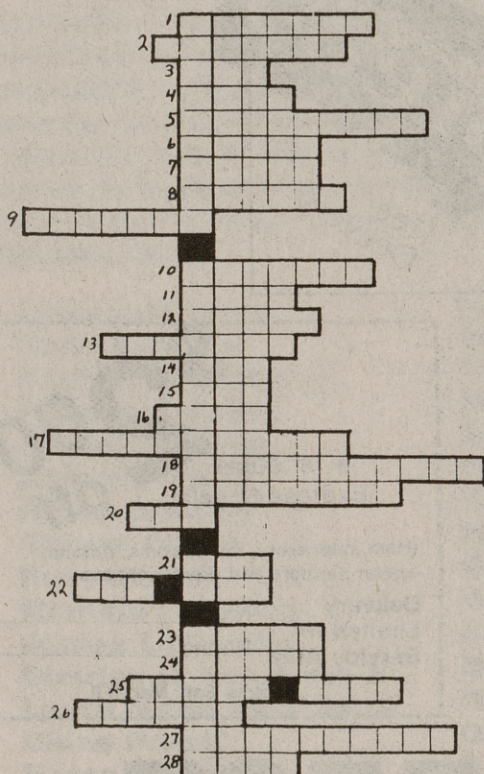

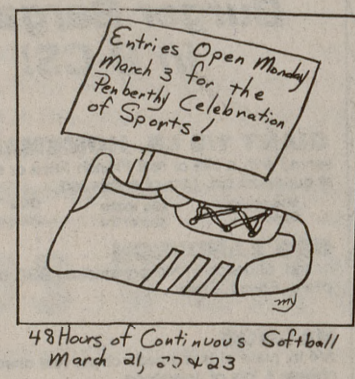
