
Overdue book notices sent because of computer mistake

During the first few weeks of January, the computer used by the circulation division of the Sterling C. Evans Library was out of service. This shutdown was due to a new data base being installed at the Data Processing Center for the circulation di-

Emma Perry, head of the circulation division, said the installation was supposed to be completed before the end of the Christmas break but it was not finished until after the first week of the spring semester.

During this time, since books

checked out and returned were recorded by hand, the computer had no record of these exchanges. This

caused complications, Perry said. The computer listed some returned books as overdue since there was no record, she said. Conse quently, many students and faculty members received unmerited over due notices

Perry said the circulation staff, which is mainly in charge of checkout and return of materials, depends on the computer system to keep track of all book exchanges.

When someone checks out a book, the staff member uses the book data card to enable the computer to keep track of the book

When the book is returned, the data card is presented in another read station where the computer re-

Each day the computer prints out a list of unreturned books, Perry said. Seven days after the due date, if the book has not been returned, the borrower is sent an overdue notice.

In seven more days, if the book still hasn't been returned, it is listed on what Perry called the "extremely overdue list," which includes the ID number of the borrower.
