United Press International INDIANAPOLIS — Some have said Louisville was a onedimensional team whose success rested squarely on the shoulders of All-America Darrell Griffith. But one person has insisted all season it

That was Darrell Criffith. Griffith did score 23 points to lead the Cardinals to a 59-54 victory over UCLA in the NCAA championship finals Monday night, to end the Bruins' Cinderella season almost at the stroke of midnight at Market Square Arena.

But it was Griffith, the tournament MVP, who insisted the titlewinning game was a team effort - as the entire 33-3 championship season






