WASHINGTON — An environmental group Monday named its
"filthy five" "filthy five" - corporations it said have bad cleanup records supported through big contributions to sympathetic members of congress.

The five companies singled out by Environmental Action were Dow Chemical Co., International Paper Co., Occidental Petroleum Corp., Republic Steel Corp. and Standard Oil Co. of Indiana.

The group, which also hicks a "dirdozen" members of Congress at election time based on voting records, said the five companies gave \$694,272 to 352 candidates for federal office in 1978. Of that \$39,072 went to anti-environmental candidates compared to \$122,227 to proenvironmentalists, it said.


Satterwhite appealed to the Supreme Court, arguing she was denied a hearing to show she was a representative of the discriminated class.


