

Corps of Cadets will march to Brazos River

The Corps of Cadets will begin its fourth annual March to the Brazos Saturday morning.

Members of the Corps have been taking pledges for the 14-mile march since the beginning of this month, and the money will be donated to the March of Dimes.

Mike Weaver, chairman of the march, said the goal this year is \$25,000. Last year the Corps donated \$19,000 to the charity.

The march will begin at 7:30 a.m. at the quad and the cadets will march seven miles along State Highway 60 to an area by the Brazos River where relay games and a tug-of-war will be held.

Six of the Dallas Cowboy Cheer-

leaders will be on hand to referee the relays.

Red Brown, Corps public relations officer, said last year was the first time the cheerleaders participated in the event. Nadine Schramm, daughter of the general manager of the Cowboy organization, attends Texas A&M and helped arrange for the cheerleaders' appearance, he said.

After lunch, the outfit that collected the most money will be awarded the "battered boot" trophy. Streamers for outfit flags will be awarded to the three units scoring the most points in the relays, Weaver said.

The Corps will march back to campus at about 3 p.m. Anyone who wishes to pledge

money may contact any cadet on campus or call Weaver at 845-2250, or Brown at 845-2350.

The march is bound to spark a hearty appetite which should make for an interesting pizza-eating contest at Pasta's Pizza Sunday at 5 p.m.

Brett Morris, manager of Pasta's, said the restaurant will donate \$500 to the March of Dimes in the name of the outfit that wins the contest. In addition, the outfit will win a keg of beer to help wash down the pizza, he said.

Each outfit will pay for the pizza and drinks consumed by its representative, and the one who eats the most pizza in one hour will win the contest.

The pizzas, which weigh about 11 pounds, will be 20 inches wide and will have everything on them, Morris said.

Ordinance requiring smoke alarm tabled

The College Station City Council tabled an ordinance requiring smoke detectors to be installed in all condominiums and apartment complexes Thursday night.

The existing ordinance states only new housing structures must have smoke detectors, City Manager North Bardell said.

The suggested ordinance, which excludes hotels and motels in the city, was made in order to decrease the fire hazard in structures where one attic covers eight to 12 apartments, Bardell said.

A representative of Briarwood Apartments told the council he was in favor of saving lives, but not at the expense of housing owners.

The Briarwood spokesman sug-

gested the city lower the garbage collection fee for apartment owners to offset the cost of building and installing the detectors.

Councilmen James Dozier compared the subsidizing suggestion to a government paying car manufacturers to install safety belts.

"I don't think the city should subsidize smoke detectors," Dozier said. "It simply isn't a function of government."

The new ordinance, if passed, would call for each dwelling unit within a complex to have one alarm

by March 1, 1982. The Parkland Dedication Ordinance, which establishes a tax to be used for city parks, was increased 50 percent from the previous \$150 per dwelling unit.

This will affect apartment complex owners most. In a memo to the council from Al Mayo, director of planning, it was noted that at the rate of 133 dwelling units per acre, the owner would have to pay, at the previous rate, \$19,950. Owners will now have to pay nearly \$30,000.

Ticket raise still pending

The proposal by the University Traffic Panel to increase traffic violation fines by 100 percent is still being considered by the Texas A&M University division of Student Services.

Dr. John Koldus, vice president for student services, said he and division administrators are currently studying the recommendation the panel made in mid-February. If the proposal is recommended, it will be placed on the May 2 agenda for consideration by the Board of Regents.

"Theoretically, all we want to do is control the situation as best we can," Koldus said. The \$5 fee obviously doesn't act as a deterrent, he said, and the increase might minimize the number of violations.

"It seems to make sense," Koldus said. The panel's motion would increase next year's fees for parking violations from \$5 to \$10 and would increase moving violations from \$10 to \$20. A limit of four parking and two moving violations is also included in the proposal.

The Texas A&M Student Senate voted Wednesday to oppose the increase.
