**Aluminum recycling drive will kick off Earth Day '80**

Mark your calendar: April 22 is Earth Day '80, a nationwide celebration of progress the environmental movement has made in the past decade.

The Wildlife Society is bringing Earth Day '80 to Texas A&M University by conducting an aluminum recycling drive and organizing activities on campus to coincide with others around the country.

Peyton Hughes, a senior wildlife and fisheries science major, is Earth Day '80 coordinator for Texas A&M. Heading up the can drive, she is also contacting campus groups that might be interested in joining the Earth Day celebration.

"We want to make people aware that this earth is our basic substratum for life," Hughes said.

Money from the cans, which are being collected in parking lot 49 behind the Grove and near soft drink machines on campus, will go to several national ecological societies.

Earth Day '70, the first Earth Day, began a decade of increased environmental awareness in the United States. While it emphasized the effects of pollution on the environment, this year it will focus on the progress of communities.

Wildlife Society members will sell a limited number of Earth Day '80 T-shirts and biodegradable bumper stickers that have a life expectancy of one month.

When the day arrives, Hughes hopes to have exhibits set up in the MSC Main Hall or by Rudder Fountain.

Highlighting the good and bad points of the Texas coast, the Wildlife Society will have a Year of the Coast display. For example, Hughes said sewage is being dumped into Laguna Madre near Brownsville, and the ecological balance of the area is upset.

A petition table will be set up to collect signatures protesting this and similar environmental issues, in addition to instructions on how to write congressmen.

Other displays include do-it-yourself solar and earth-sheltered

housing, biological pest control and a herpetology (snake) display. Hughes said several other clubs are considering organizing presentations as well.

With a contribution of \$750, Sigma Lambda Alpha, the architecture honor society, is helping finance Earth Day. Several sororities and a fraternity are also considering helping out.

Robert Dowler, an instructor in the wildlife and fisheries science department, said, "The whole idea behind Earth Day is to keep the idea going."

And he hopes to do this by setting up an aluminum collection site at the

Brazos Valley Museum, located at the Brazos Center at 3232 Brazos Drive. This could be managed by volunteers on weekends, he said.

Money from the cans would go to the museum, which is the state's natural science museum in the middle of the 3-million-acre Fort Worth area.

The Putnam Corp. of Fort Worth, which is paying the Wildlife Society 35 cents a pound for cans collected until Earth Day, will pick up cans in Res there are enough. Dowler estimated there will be about two tons of cans.

However, his idea is still in the planning stages and anyone interested in helping with the project should call Dowler at 845-6753.
