# Major firms to visit A&M Career Fair

For a graduating senior, finding a  
job could be as easy as socializing at a  
barbecue dinner.  
During the College of Business  
Administration's first annual Business  
Student Career Fair April 16  
and 17, a barbecue dinner will be  
one event planned to give business  
students of all classifications a chance  
to meet company representatives on an  
informal basis.  
The fair which is also open to non-  
business majors is part of a week-long  
observance of Business Week,  
April 11-18, at Texas A&M University.  
"The Career Fair has three purposes,"  
said Lynn Zimmerman,  
assistant to the dean of business  
administration. "First, it gives the  
opportunity for recruiting com-

panies and graduating seniors to get  
together.  
"Secondly, it gives recruiting  
companies an opportunity to meet  
juniors who'll be in the recruiting  
market next year.  
"And thirdly, it gives juniors,  
sophomores and freshmen the  
opportunity to become better in-  
formed on their career choices."  
Representatives from Dow Chemi-  
cal USA, Continental Pipeline  
Co., Tenneco Oil Exploration and  
Production, Exxon Co. USA, Brown  
& Root, Houston Lighting & Power  
Co. and several accounting firms will  
be among the companies attending.  
Guest speaker Joe Reynolds of  
Procter & Gamble will speak on in-  
terviewing during a seminar sched-  
uled for 3 p.m. April 16 in the Rudder  
Forum.  
The barbecue will be at the Brazos

Center that night for company  
representatives, business students and  
faculty. A thousand tickets will be  
available at \$3 each. Students  
sign up to sit with particular  
companies at the barbecue.  
Oscar Newton, senior  
president of the American  
Life Insurance Co. will speak  
"Leadership and Academic  
Achievement." There will also  
be presentation of business  
academic achievement awards  
during the dinner.  
The big attraction for April  
16-17 are 34 company booths to be set  
up on the second floor of the Memorial  
Student Center.  
The Placement Center,  
10th floor of Rudder Tower, has  
many files which supply firm  
names, facts and figures about  
companies.
