Wood was shot in the back and killed outside his San Antonio apartment last May 29 and the crime has not been solved. Tower and Loeffler will present Wood's wife a copy of a public law renaming the federal courthouse in his honor during a 2 p.m. ceremony at the building.

Museums show Vikings not bad

United Press International LONDON — Top museums in London and New York have decided the time is ripe to give those poor put-upon Vikings a bright new image.

"The Vikings have had a bad press," says David M. Wilson, director of the British Museum, about a spectacular exhibition which Queen Elizabeth opened in London recently and which moves to New York in September. "Their activities are equated with rape and pillage and their reputation is second only to that of the Huns and the Goths," Wilson says. But an explosion of archeological discovery in the last 15 years has uncovered the peaceful side of those bloodthirsty hordes which swept out of the north 1,000 years ago to terrorize most of the known world.

"The Vikings were administrators as well as pirates, merchants as well as robbers," says Viking specialist Wilson. To prove it, his British Museum and New York's Metropolitan Museum of Art — working together for the first time — are staging a never-to-be-repeated display of 543 objects which will show what else besides "rape and pillage" the Vikings achieved.

Just inside the entrance is a complete Viking house, a loom for weaving near its open fire. Beyond the house are Viking games and wood-working tools, a glittering treasury of gold and silver jewelry, even evidence of Viking fashions. Like the show of Tutankhamen's treasure, "The Vikings" has loosed a flood of information, including a 10-part BBC television series and some two dozen books. Wilson's own "The Viking Achievement" is one, and there are lavish productions like James Graham-Campbell's "The Viking World." None of them denies that the Vikings were savage and bloody. For generations English churchmen prayed, "From the fury of the Northmen, deliver us O Lord." And they had good reason. "In a brutal age the Vikings were brutal," Wilson says. "But their brutality was no worse than that of their contemporaries. It is not without significance that the English word 'law' has a Scandinavian root." Norse raiders first erupted during the 8th century and terrorized

zations for 300 years, but the image of horn-helmeted warriors in the show is the sign of horns.

And those fearless fighters ran instead of giving battle. "Whenever there was a stern fight, the Vikings ran," Graham-Campbell says. "The more concerned with empty glory." One of the new discoveries — has added much knowledge of Viking secret weapons, the "serpents of the sea." The ships were a technological through, capable of landing on a harborless shore with surprising suddenness.

Ships are prominent in the exhibition — a two-thirds scale replica of a ship is beached on the Museum lawn. Swords and also fill cases. But these weapons were encrusted with gold until they became beautiful. The Vikings adored display the exhibition overflows with gold worn by women and men, decorated brooches and cloaks thick with writhing, interlaced animals.

The plow was as much a weapon as the sword, and the scales were more than either. "They traveled further than any other people before them," says Graham-Campbell. "They were farmers in the barren western of Greenland and discovered it; they served as mercenaries in the court of Byzantium." Vikings founded Dublin, in Newfoundland, penetrated Baghdad and had a trading post in Kiev. Normans who conquered England and Sicily were descended from Vikings, and Russia may be from one label for the Northmen. "Rus." London was once a city and a Viking king briefly ruled Britain. These Scandinavian voyagers are a genius for blending into the advanced civilizations they entered. They adopted Christianity eventually. Several beautiful objects and other Christian relics were on display at the exhibition.
