**Russia tests
new satellite**

MOSCOW** — The Soviet Union Monday announced the launching of Cosmos-1172, apparently the second stage of its latest "hunter-killer" satellite experiment.

At the same time, officials announced Soyuz-35 cosmonauts Valery Ryumin and Leonid Popov are trying to hatch bird eggs in space.

The official Tass news agency said Cosmos-1172 was launched Saturday and has an orbital inclination to the earth of 62.3 degrees.

That is within the 59-67 degree range of most of the Soviet "hunter-killer" satellites, which are used to test the ability of one satellite to shoot down another in space.

On April 3, the Soviets launched Cosmos-1171, believed to be a target for the current "hunter-killer" experiment.

Radio Moscow announced the Soyuz-35 cosmonauts, who were launched into space last Wednesday, have gone into the egg hatching business aboard the Salyut-6 orbiting space laboratory where they are docked.

**Three Japanese sentenced
on charges of Soviet spying**

TOKYO** — A retired major general and two officers of the Japanese army were jailed Monday for sentences ranging from eight months to one year for passing military secrets to the Soviet Union.

Tokyo District Judge Hideo Kamigaki handed down a one-year jail sentence for Yukihiya Miyanaga, 58, and eight-month sentences for 2nd Lt. Eiichi Kashii, 45, and Warrant Officer Tsunetoshi Oshima, 49.

The court heard that in September 1979, Oshima passed classified docu-

ments to Miyanaga, who then gave the information to a Soviet spy network.

None of the three defendants tested the charges.

Col. Yuri Kozlov of the Soviet embassy, identified by metropolitan police as one of Miyanaga's contacts, left Japan for home one day after the three were arrested.

Director General Enji Kubota of the Defense Agency resigned in early February, taking the blame for the first espionage case in Japan involving officers of the self-defense forces.

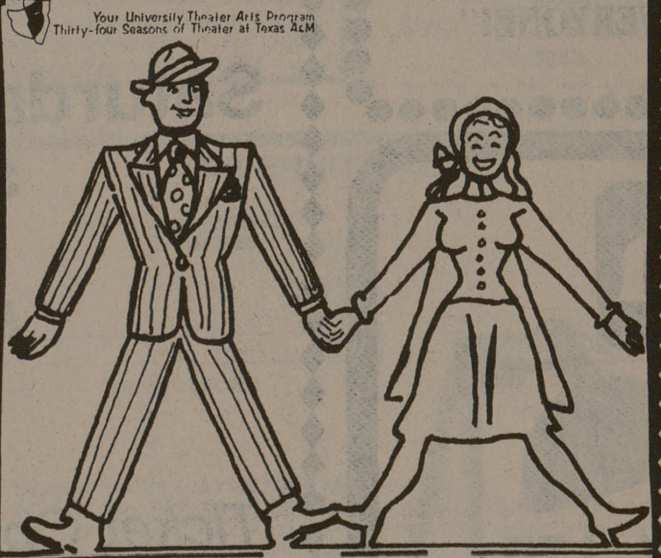
