

United Press International President Carter gained a bit more ground today on rival Edward Ken-nedy in Idaho's Democratic caucuses, and Repulican front-runner Ronald Reagan Thursday added a dozen North Dakota delegates to his

Carter, however, fell just short of winning a majority of Idaho's 17 Democratic National Convention delegates, picking up eight to Kennedy's five. Four delegates will be

uncommitted, party officials said. With 34 of Idaho's 35 legislative district caucuses reporting early today, Carter won 49 percent, or 181,
