OKLAHOMA CITY — Watching students go to sleep during economics lectures was one symptom. Another was a Gallup poll which revealed that 50 percent of college students thought the oil industry should be nationalized.

Administrators at Oklahoma Christian College, which has close ties to the business leadership in Oklahoma City, felt the public was growing ignorant of economic principles. "We feel there's a great gap in economic understanding that penalizes the country," said R. Stafford North, OCC executive vice president. One answer, OCC President J. Terry Johnson and others believe, lies in entertaining the masses while educating them.

So OCC began raising money to build Enterprise Square, USA, envisioned as a cross between a theme park and an economics class. It will be housed on the OCC campus in a building designed especially for it. More than \$7 million of the \$15 million total cost has been raised, largely from business.

"What it is, really, is pop education," said James L. Stafford, whose firm is handling promotion. As visitors make their way through the center — probably about a four-hour trip — they will follow a story, told through puppets. Portraying aliens from outer space, the puppets will start their own business on Earth.

Visitors will participate via computer games such as one in which the player drills for oil and must make split-second decisions whether to drill deeper or stop as costs escalate by the second.

A Hall of Giants tentatively is planned to feature 16-foot high heads of outstanding achievers in business, entertainment and athletics. These will be lighted at night in a window to attract passing motorists.

Some of the original plans have been changed, however, because the message was "too doctrinaire," Stafford said. "If you become doctrinaire or attempt to propagandize, you turn people off," Stafford said.

North agreed, saying they just want to improve people's understanding. "We are hoping people will understand profits and how much profits are. We are not advocating government is bad and no government is good."

Backers of the project are big business leaders, but North said, "We are determined not to make it a place that is trying to defend big business or side with business against labor."

Donations have come from Phillips Petroleum Co., \$2 million; Samuel Roberts Noble Foundation, \$1.5 million, and Edward L.

Gaylord, president of the Oklahoma Publishing Co., \$1 million. He is chairman of the OCC board of governors. Lamar Firestone, of Los Angeles, a former Firestone Tire & Rubber Co. executive, contributed.

A task force of economists, writer and two script writers have been hired to plan the center.

Among them are Rod Lopez, rega of Westport, Conn., an animation designer whose clients included AT&T, Dictaphone, General Electric, IBM and Alvin Rabushka, senior fellow Hoover Institution on War, Revolution and Peace of Stanford University and previously associate professor of political science at the University of Rochester.

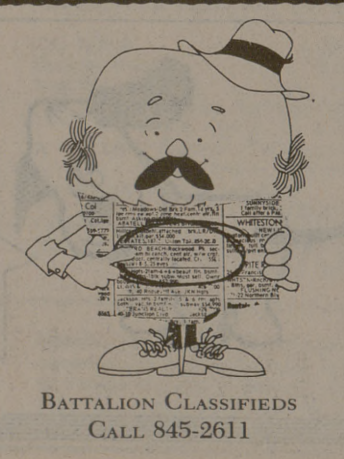
