

# College to operate economics square' 1-

OKLAHOMA CITY — Watching
students go to sleep during economics lectures was one symptom.

Another was a Gallup poll which revealed that 50 percent of college students thought the oil industry should be nationalized.

Administrators at Oklahoma Christian College, which has close ties to the business leadership in Oklahoma City, felt the public was growing ignorant of economic princi-

We feel there's a great gap in economic understanding that penalizes the country," said R. Stafford North, OCC executive vice president.
One answer, OCC President J.

Terry Johnson and others believe. lies in entertaining the masses while educating them. So OCC began raising money to
