Honors to 14 Carter to award freedom medals

WASHINGTON — President Carter announced Monday he will award the 1980 Medals of Freedom to his mentor Adm. Hyman Rickover, President Lyndon B. Johnson, former Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey, actor John Wayne, photographer Ansel Adams and nine others.

The awards will be presented at a ceremony in the White House June 9.

Johnson, Humphrey, Wayne and scientist Rachel Carson's all are post-humous.

Other recipients will be Lucia Chase, director of the American Ballet Theater; Greek Orthodox Bishop Iakovos; Clarence Mitchell Jr., retired director of the NAACP Washington bureau; ornithologist Roger Tory Peterson; soprano Beverly Sills, now director of the New York City Opera, and Pulitzer Prize writers Robert Penn Warren, Eudora Welty and Tennessee Williams.

Rickover is recognized as the father of the nuclear submarine. He is presently director of naval reactors for the Energy Research and Development Administration. Carter, a former nuclear submariner, titled his autobiography after a question Rickover once put to him: "Why Not the Best?"

The presidential Medal of Freedom was initiated in 1945 to recognize Americans who have made an especially meritorious contribution to "the security or national interests of the United States, or world peace, cultural or other significant public or private endeavors."



Draft bill vote begins today

WASHINGTON — President Carter's plan to register young men for selective military service goes to its first floor vote today.

At that time the House will consider a bill to provide \$13.3 million to pay for the draft registration program.

House leaders say they have enough votes to pass the measure,

but opponents are preparing to wage a strong fight. If the bill survives, foes are counting on a threatened filibuster to block it in the Senate.

The plan would require all 19- and 20-year-old men to register at their local post offices, creating a pool of 4 million available on call. An actual draft cannot be started without approval by Congress.

Doux Chene lot scene of assault

A Bryan man reportedly was assaulted in the parking lot of the Doux Chene Apartments early Monday morning.

Michael Scott Murphy, 21, of 4022 Green Valley Drive, told police he was kicked in the stomach and cut in the face while trying to defend a female companion who was being harassed by a man who followed the couple from a nearby convenience store to the parking lot.

Murphy was taken to St. Joseph Hospital, where he was treated for a facial cut.

A police report stated that Murphy and his companion were about to leave the 7-11 store near the Doux Chene complex at about 12:30 a.m. when a man, described as approximately 22 years old, drove up to Murphy's car and began talking to the woman, who was in the driver's seat.

She drove off, and was into the parking lot by the man was driving a pickup truck, report said.

The man went up to Murphy and once again began talking to her. Murphy then told her to leave her alone, but was told by the man to "back off."

Murphy reportedly told police that he didn't want any trouble and once again told him to leave the woman alone.

The man repeated that he better back off, but when he refused to move, he was hit in the stomach and cut in the face. Murphy pushed his attacker away, the man then got in his car and fled, the report said.

According to the report, he mistook Murphy's companion for a roommate, whom he had seen earlier at Studio 2818.

EPA to eliminate benzene

WASHINGTON — The Environmental Protection Agency said Monday it wants to virtually eliminate the amount of cancer-causing benzene being spewed from eight plants across the country near which 10 million Americans live.

The plants produce maleic anhydride, a chemical used in the plastics, pesticides and lubricating industries, among others.

Benzene, a proven cancer-linked to leukemia and other disorders, is a raw material used in the production of maleic anhydride. The process is emitted into the air.

"The proposed standard will require essentially 97 percent of benzene emissions from these sources, and elimination of benzene from new sources," said EPA Administrator Douglas Costle.


