Parents take over special ed

NACOGDOCHES — Parents and educators were so impressed with the Nacogdoches Independent School District's special education program that they took over more than allow the district to disband.

Housed in a small six-room building, RAP, short for Rapid Advancement Program, was started in 1975 to teach the school district's "unable" children — those with low achievement scores, disciplinary problems or excessive truancy.

The students showed immediate improvement but declining enrollment eventually discouraged school district.

For three years after RAP's enrollment grew to a high of 50 during the next two years enrollment declined, resulting in a school board decision to close the program, testing parents, however, was a year reprieve.

Enrollment fell to 24 students in 1978. The school board voted to close the school at the end of 1977-78 school year. But instead of closing, the school simply reorganized, with parents playing a bigger role than before.

Parents, many of them middle and low income, had from the beginning sat on RAP's board of directors. Now they operate the school funds raised by parents and grants from various agencies and private donations.

The school provides one teacher for each six students — a far more individualized approach to education than is normally possible in public schools. Students progress at their own rate within a curriculum tailored to their own needs.

Achievement scores increased until students were acquiring month's skills in one month's time. Teachers said their students were far more interested in learning.

Head teacher Vicki Stephens, who taught in public schools for years, said she could never teach a regular school.

"There's not the (same) feedback she said. "Everything is so personalized. Here we get to know each child and build a program around each of them."

In support of RAP, one parent borrowed \$1,000 against a car to help RAP face a particularly tight financial problem. Teachers have contributed; Stephens said canceled checks show she has \$1,200 last year.

Stephen F. Austin University professor Dr. G.W. Willingham, founder of the school, ended up purchasing the house where the school is located.

Willingham says that he, the rents and the teachers are determined to keep the school open somehow.

"As far as I know, RAP is where in the country. If we can't make it happen here, it will be a matter of others to show they can do it."

Families sue tanker owners

HOUSTON — A lawyer has filed lawsuits claiming \$15.6 million in damages for the families of 12 oil seamen killed in the collision of an oil tanker with a five-mile freighter Mimoso five miles from the entrance to Galveston Bay.

Each family seeks \$700,000. Nov. 1, 1979, accident in which crewmen died.

Lawyer John deGravelle of Rouge, La., said the suits were against owners of both vessels. Juniper Shipping and Western Shipping — on grounds it was matter who was at fault because seamen were "innocent victims."

A tentative report by the U.S. government said officers of both vessels were at fault in the collision.
