

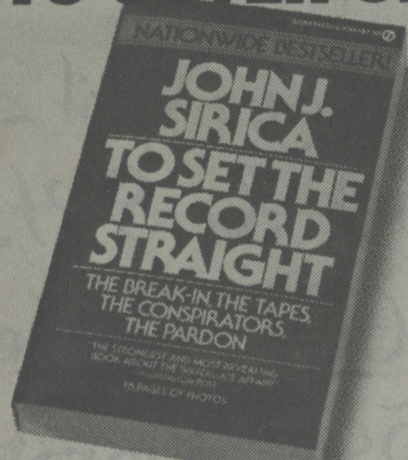

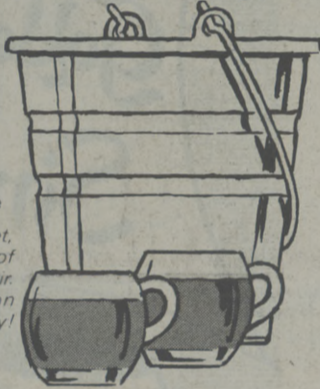

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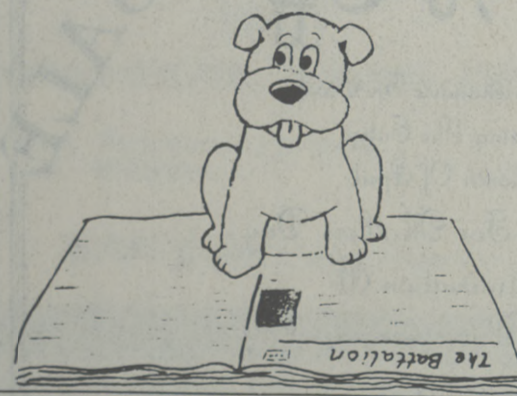

age or better (a grade point ratio of 2.0 or more). Regular students who do not meet this requirement are prohibited from the University from serving as officers in any University-recognized organization and are eventually expelled if they fail to reach a 2.0 GPA. No student is allowed to retain a University-administered scholarship if his GPA falls below 2.0.

Athletes, however, are once again governed by SWC regulations rather than by Texas A&M's. The SWC does not require any minimum GPA, instead requiring a certain number of hours be passed each semester. The conference never requires an athlete pass more than 24 hours every 12 months, and freshmen are only required to pass 20 semester hours their first year.

For SWC purposes, no minimum GPA is required, and a course grade of "D" is considered the same as an "A" — both are passing. One just a football team member, a starter, and a 0.9 GPA. Ten other upperclassmen on football scholarships have below 1.8, and 30 percent of the football scholarship students have below a 2.0 GPA.

Athletes also have received preferential treatment in University disciplinary actions. A regular student who has been placed on conditional probation loses all University-administered financial aid and is ineligible to represent the University in any official function.

Athletes who have been placed on conditional probation, however, have not lost their scholarships. Two football players who were placed on conditional probation last fall were on athletic scholarships until this spring. They were expelled by Jerry Mainord, assistant director of student affairs, following their arrest by College Station police for the theft of the stolen material. The owner of the stolen material did not press charges.

Athletic scholarships are administered by a sub-committee of the University's Scholarships Committee. Dr. Bob Johnson, assistant director of student financial aid, said the committee always accepts and reviews the sub-committee's recommendations.

Texas A&M also provides athletes with a service specifically prohibited by NCAA regulations. Secretaries Cain Hall, the athletic dormitory, regularly type class papers for athletes in spite of the NCAA specifically prohibiting this practice.

"If that's a violation, we're in violation," said Tate, when questioned about the practice.

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
