

UT first, Ags third in AIAW

HOUSTON — Debbie Petrizzi of the University of Texas and teammate Carol Blackmar both shot 3-over-par 75 in gusty winds Sunday to lead the University of Texas into a first-round lead at the AIAW state championship. Texas with 307 was the team lead-

er going into Monday's second round of the three-day tournament at the 5,609-yard Pecan Grove Country Club.

Texas Christian was second at 310, followed by Texas A&M University at 313, Houston Baptist at 318, and Texas Tech at 322.

Ashby, Astros slip past Mets

HOUSTON — Houston swept a three-game series from the New York Mets during the weekend, so Jeff Leonard had room to talk.

"I wouldn't put down the Mets," he said, "but I thought they were a better team than they showed this weekend."

Instead, it was Leonard and the other Astros who showed off, Leonard hitting a one-out, two-run single in the bottom of the 12th inning that sealed Sunday's 4-3 comeback victory.

Much of the blame, at least in post-game discussions, landed on Mets relief pitcher Neil Allen, 0-3, who issued a one-out walk to Cesar Cedeno, then watched Alan Ashby double to put runners on second and third. Art Howe was intentionally walked to load the bases before Leonard delivered his shot off the right-center field fence. "He wasn't very good today," Mets manager Joe Torre said of Allen, "but he will be. His control trouble is a temporary thing. He's a gutsy pitcher who should become a good reliever." The kindest words came from

Ashby, who noted, "He has as good a curve ball as anyone in the National League." Ashby was Houston's fire-power Sunday, staking the Astros to a 2-0 lead off starter Ray Burris, driving in Cedeno with a third inning double and then hitting his first home run of the season with two out in the fifth. He attributed his on-the-money play to his return to switch-hitting.

"I don't feel anything like I did last year," when he had given up switch-hitting, the catcher said. "Last season, lefthanders got me out so easily that I couldn't hit righthanders, and struggled all year."

Despite two different minor injuries, a bad toe and tendonitis in his right knee, "I've got to where I'm running on the side of my foot pretty easily. The biggest problem is picking up my legs and to do the catcher's job."


Ashby speculated a bit on the Astros' pitching staff, saying everyone can't be expected to be strong all the time.

"They (the Mets) pretty much saw what we have to offer this weekend," he said.


