

# Astros beat Reds, 3-0

CINCINNATI — Cesar Cedeno hit his first home run of the year Tuesday night to back the three-hit

pitching of Ken Forsch and pace the Houston Astros to a 3-0 victory over the Cincinnati Reds.

Forsch, 3-0, struck out two and walked three in notching his first complete game and first shutout of the season.

The Astros scored their first run off Reds' starter Charlie Leibrandt, 1-2, in the fourth inning when Joe Morgan led off with a single to right, stole second and, after an infield hit by Art Howe, scored when Enos Cabell hit into a double play.

Cedeno's homer, after Jose Cruz reached on a fielder's choice in the

sixth, slammed high off the left-field foul pole to give the Astros' their final two runs.

The Reds mounted their only scoring threat in the fifth when Ray Knight reached on a fielder's choice with two out, Cesar Geronimo doubled and Leibrandt walked to load the bases. Forsch then struck out Ken Griffey to end the inning.

With the defeat of Cincinnati, Houston moves to within half a game of the Reds, who are in first place in the National League Western Division. The two teams face each other again today at 7:05 CST in Cincinnati.

# Rangers win, 10-5

DETROIT — Richie Zisk, Pepe Frias and Mickey Rivers drove in two runs each Tuesday to lead the Texas Rangers to a 10-5 clubbing over the Detroit Tigers in a game shortened to seven innings by rain.

The Rangers, who got a sacrifice from Al Oliver in the first inning, plated four runs with five consecutive hits in the second inning off Morris, 3-2, and John Hiller.

Pat Putnam doubled in a run and singled in a run with a shot that went off Morris' thigh and sent him from the game with a bruise that wasn't considered severe.

Rivers added an RBI single and Camp Willis a sacrifice fly.

Zisk belted a two-run homer in the sixth and scored another run in the sixth on a single by Buddy Bell, following a Rivers double.

The Rangers' final two runs came in the seventh off Jack Billingham, scoring on a single by Rivers and the other on Frias' sacrifice fly.

Lance Parrish hit a three-run homer in the fifth off starter Steve Lerner, 1-2, and the Tigers tagged Lerner for two more runs in the seventh, the runs scoring on singles by Champ Summers and John Wocken-

the game was held up for 44 minutes after the Tigers batted in the seventh before it was called by the umpires.

# SMU team faces crisis

DALLAS — SMU Athletic Director Russ Potts says the school will not have a baseball team next year only if members of this year's team are interested.

Potts told the players Monday that SMU would honor the existing scholarships and would play a Southwest Conference schedule in 1981 if the players were interested.

"I wanted to tell the players now because several of them have indicated that they might transfer to another school," Potts said. "If most of the scholarship players want to stay, we would not have a team."

Potts said the main problem was if SMU has a team next year, a player who transfers would not be eligible to play immediately. If SMU drops the team, those players who transfer would be eligible immediately at another school.

"I told the members of the team to talk about it and let me know by Monday," Potts said. "My major concern is for the players. I'm fully supportive of any decision they make."
