## Divorces now commonplace

A child's reaction to a divorce may differ depending on his age. Dr. Felice Klein, a Bryan marriage and femily counselor, said the most diffi-cult age for a child is 5 or 6. "At this age the child is very attached to the parent of the opposite sex," she ex-plained. "The removal of this parent can be detrimental to the child's physical and mental development.


Klein said the role of the marriage and family counselor has gone through many changes in the last 10
