Teams 'on the road' while most Ags study

Despite the fact that most Texas A&M University students will be stuck in their apartments or dorms cramming for next week's final exams, some Aggie sports teams are going to be on the road.

Here's a look at some of the upcoming action:
Softball—College Station is hosting the SWAIW Division 1 and 2 Regional Softball Championships at Bee Creek this week, and the action all boils down to the finals tonight.

The Division 1 finals will be played at 5 p.m. and the Division 2 finals will be played at 7 p.m.

The tournament, which has been going on since Wednesday night, has had several superlative efforts thus far. In the second round of the Division 1 tournament Wednesday, Sam Houston State clipped the No. 1 team in the nation, Texas Women's University, 5-4. Also in the second round, the Texas A&M women's team pulled off their first triple play of the season against Northeast Louisiana University while trouncing them, 13-2.

Golf—The men's team travelled to Athens, Ga., Thursday, and will compete in the Southern Golf Tournament through Saturday.

The Aggies recently finished fourth in the Southwest Conference tournament April 18-20. Houston

won the tournament, followed by TCU, Texas and Texas A&M.

Tennis—Four members of the Texas A&M women's team are in Odessa at the University of Texas-Permian Basin for the State Individual Singles and Doubles Tournament.

The competition will be held through Saturday, and Aggies Kathleen Sissom, Terri Nuetze, Judy Willard and Liliana Fernandez will compete.

Each will play individually in singles. Sissom and Nuetze will play together in one doubles bracket, while Fernandez and Willard play in another.

The winners in the state tournament will participate in the Regional Tournament to be held in Baton Rouge, La., May 18-19.

Track—The men's team will divide up to participate in two track meets Saturday in Houston.

The Miller High Lite Meet, to be held at the University of Houston track, is an invitational competition, and 10 Aggies will compete.

Some of the Aggies and their events are: Leslie Kerr in the 400-meter relay; Randy Hall in the pole vault; Tim Scott in the shot put and discus; Kerr, Steve Willis, Vernon Pittman and Curtis Dickey in the 400-meter relay; and James Washington, Willis, Kerr and Pittman in the 1,600-meter relays.

The Miller meet also will have several top West German and Russian athletes, along with several U.S. stars.

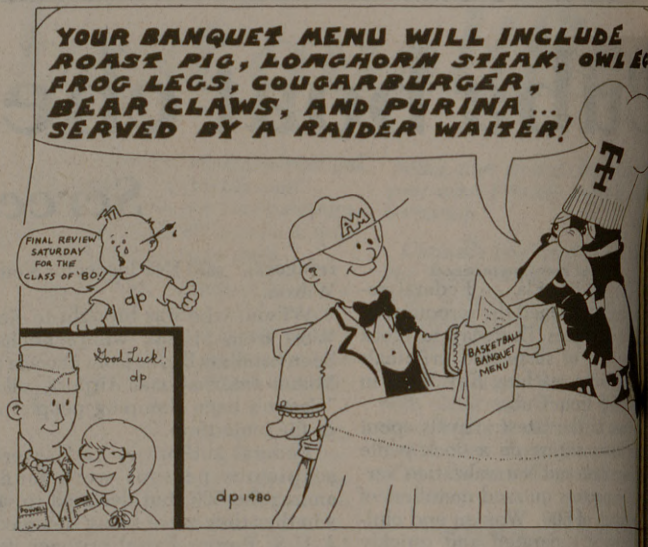
"The guys are going to have to run like rabbits to place in this meet," said Charlie Thomas, Texas A&M track coach. "These are world-class athletes, including the best in the United States."

Curtis Dickey, recently picked fifth in the NFL college football draft, was questionable for the meet, but preliminary indications are Dickey will run.

The other tracksters not competing in the Miller meet will be across Houston Saturday at the Meet of Champions on the Houston Baptist College track.

The Aggie track team comes off a highly successful showing at the Florida State meet in Tallahassee last Saturday. Although no team scores were kept, the Ags had six first-place finishes. Tim Scott, who won first in the shot put and the discus, was selected the meet's outstanding performer.

The women's track team will be in Austin for the University of Texas track meet tonight.

Rockets' Harris rehired as coach

HOUSTON — Houston Rockets owner George Maloof has given Del Harris a three-year contract to continue as head coach of the team he directed to the playoffs in his first season, the club announced Thursday.

"Del's achievements merit the contract he has received," Maloof said. "He integrated four new players into a new system, overcame 100 player-games lost due to injury or illness, yet managed to rally his players to post the third best record in club history."

The Rockets were 41-41, including victories in 16 of their last 29 games, and defeated San Antonio in the first round of the NBA playoffs before losing to Boston in four games.

"I am pleased at the confidence shown by the management and we can put together a team that get the job done," Harris said. "Team orientation and aggressiveness will continue to be key words in our philosophy and we believe what our fans are looking for is a job to give it to them."

Harris is a 20-year veteran who got his first NBA head coaching opportunity when he replaced Nissalke as Rockets coach last year. He had been Nissalke's assistant three years.

Harris started coaching at schools in Tennessee and served as head coach at Eastern College in Indiana for nine years before starting his professional career as an assistant at Utah.

His appointment ends three years of speculation over the future of Rockets' coaching staff.
