Opening Oswald's grave under advisement of court

United Press International FORT WORTH — British author Michael Eddowes, convinced a Russian agent is buried in the grave of presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald, Thursday argued before a federal appeals court that he should be allowed to sue for the reopening of the grave.

The three-judge panel of the state court of Civil Appeals took the case under advisement. Court spokesman Dan Bates, a briefing attorney, said the court usually takes between two and three weeks to return a decision.

Eddowes has written a book concerning a Soviet KGB agent killed by President John F. Kennedy on Nov. 22, 1963, and that it was that agent who was shot to death two days later by Dallas nightclub owner Jack Ruby.

At the request of the Oswald family, the body was taken from Dallas County to neighboring Tarrant County for burial in Rosehill cemetery in Fort Worth.

Eddowes maintains the Dallas County medical examiner's autopsy report that the body was faulty and that a complete autopsy would show the Russian agent was the assassin of Oswald.

More than a year ago Eddowes filed a state district court suit in Tarrant County demanding that the body be exhumed and a new autopsy performed. That suit was thrown

out, however, on the grounds Eddowes did not have legal standing to file the suit and that the suit should have been filed in Dallas County where the assassin was shot, not in Tarrant County where he was buried.

Eddowes and his local attorney, John Collins, argued Thursday in the

appeals court that Eddowes' lower court suit should be reinstated and scheduled for trial. They argued Tarrant County did have jurisdiction in the case, the Tarrant County medical examiner could perform a new autopsy, and Dallas County no longer had control over what happened to the body.
