**SWC tourney begins May 16**

The Southwest Conference baseball tournament will open at 5 p.m. May 16 at Olsen Field in College Station with Texas Tech University taking on the University of Texas.  
Texas A&M University will play Arkansas at 8 p.m.  
Aggie coach Tom Chandler has scheduled a four-game series against Texas Wesleyan College May 11-12, with a double-header on both days. Texas Wesleyan is ranked seventh in the nation among NAIA teams, and should provide the Aggies some good warm-up for the SWC tournament.  
Tickets for the May 16-18 SWC tournament are on sale now. They are \$3 for reserved seats, \$2 for adult general admission and \$1 for student general admission. They can be purchased at the ticket office in C. Rollie White Coliseum.  
The Saturday, May 17 schedule calls for the two Friday losers to play at 1:30 p.m., and the two Friday winners to play at 7:30 p.m. On Sunday, May 18, the survivor of the 1:30 Saturday game will play the loser of the Saturday 7:30 p.m. game at 1:30 p.m. The winner of that game will take on the winner of the 7:30 p.m. Saturday game at 7:30 p.m. Sunday night in the SWC tournament final.  
In a news conference Wednesday at Cain Hall on the Texas A&M campus, the Bryan-College Station Chamber of Commerce announced the mayors of the twin cities have named next week, May 11-18 Tournament Week in honor of the tournament.

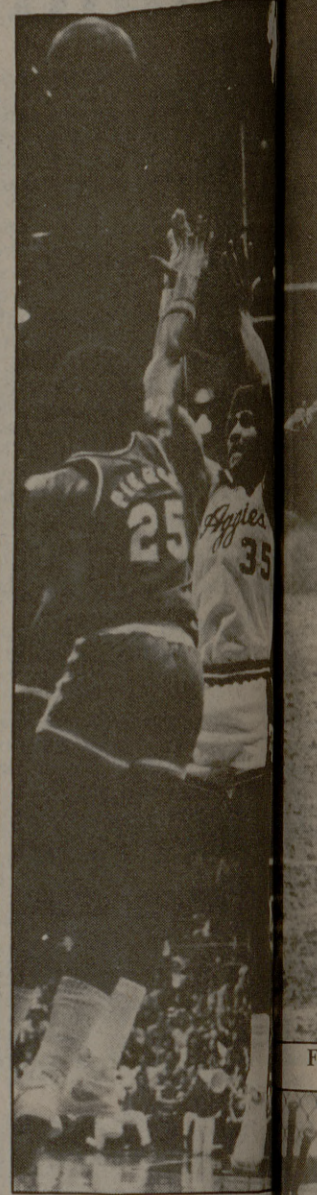

**Ag basketball team names Wright MVP**

Texas A&M University's basketball team honored All-Southwest Conference forward Rynn Wright with the team's Most Valuable Player award at the annual basketball award banquet Saturday night.  
Wright, a three-year letterman from Dallas Roosevelt, was voted the team's outstanding player by the members of the 1980 Southwest Conference-champion Aggie team. He was given the award by Coach Shelby Metcalf.  
Wright, a junior, was the second-leading scorer on the Aggie team with a 14.1 point-per-game average, and he averaged over seven rebounds per game. He was an All-SWC selection on a team that posted

a school best 26-8 record and advanced all the way to the NCAA Midwest Regional tournament before losing in overtime to the eventual national champions, Louisville.  
Wright was a first-team SWC selection by the Associated Press and United Press International. The Dallas Morning News, the Dallas Times-Herald and Texas Sports Magazine. He was also an all-tournament player at the Pillsbury Classic in Minnesota, the Runnin' Rebel Classic in Las Vegas and the SWC Post-Season Classic in San Antonio.  
Metcalf also announced Wright and Vernon Smith will be co-captains of the 1980-81 team.

**Astros down Expos 8-4**

Jose Cruz drove in four runs and Joe Niekro tossed a seven-hitter in Montreal Tuesday to lead the Houston Astros to an 8-4 victory over the Expos in a game delayed by rain for three hours and 50 minutes.  
In Arlington, Doc Medich tossed a six-hitter and won his eighth straight game over the Boston Red Sox in pitching the Texas Rangers to a 7-2 triumph.  
The Astros jumped on starter Ross Grimsley, 1-2, for five runs in the first inning. Rafael Landestoy led off with a double, Terry Puhl singled and Joe Morgan was safe on a fielder's choice to load the bases. Cesar Cedeno, who later left the game with a wrenched back, singled home the first run and Enos Cabell doubled home two more. Cruz followed with a two-run single.  
After a rain delay in the sixth, Niekro, who raised his record to 4-1 in completing his fourth game of the season, gave up two runs on a passed ball and a sacrifice fly by

Valentine in the sixth, and Montreal got its last run in the ninth.  
The victory gave Houston a 6-2 record on their current two-week road trip.  
In the Ranger victory, Medich, 2-0, struck out seven and did not walk a batter in registering his second complete game in as many starts.  
The Rangers, trailing 2-1, scored four runs in the sixth inning to knock out loser Bruce Hurst, 2-1. Singles by Al Oliver and Buddy Bell, a two-run double by Billy Sample and an RBI single by Pat Putnam knocked out Hurst and Jim Sundberg greeted reliever Dick Drago with an RBI single.  
Boston took a 2-0 lead in the second inning on Dwight Evans' homer and an RBI single by Rick Burleson, but Texas reduced the deficit to 2-1 in the fourth when Richie Zisk singled home Oliver.  
The Rangers added a run in the seventh on Bell's RBI single and pushed across another run in the eighth on a sacrifice fly by Bump Willis.

1979 NASCAR Rookie of the Year Dale Earnhardt became the first entry in the NASCAR Texas World Speedway in College Station on Sunday, June 1.  
Earnhardt, of Charlotte, N.C., currently heads the Grand National Championship point standings with nine races, and won the \$150,000 nationally-televised Busch race in February.  
Earnhardt also competed in the year's 400, but with only eight to go, he cut a tire and ended against a wall, causing the race to be run under a yellow flag. He was in second place at the time.
