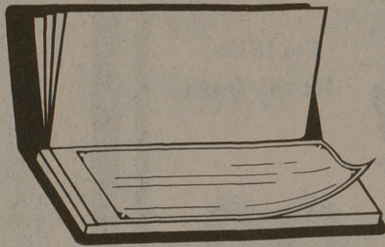

HOUSTON — Larry Parrish and Andre Dawson delivered run-producing doubles and David Palmer won his 10th consecutive game Tuesday night, leading the Montreal Expos to a 3-2 victory over the Houston Astros.

Palmer, 2-0, has not lost since July 24 of last year. He allowed five hits although he struggled with his control and walked four. Woodie Fryman got the last five outs to earn his fourth save. Both of Palmer's victo-

ries this year have come against Houston.

Dawson's third-inning double to center scored Rodney Scott, who had singled, and gave Montreal a 3-1 lead. The Expos scored twice in the first off Houston starter Nolan Ryan, 13. Scott was safe at second on Ryan's error and moved to third on a wild pitch. After Dawson walked, the Expos executed a double steal to score one run. Parrish followed with an RBI double to center.

Southwest Conference squad picked by the nine SWC coaches. They were Dave Ogrin, a senior from Waukegan, Ill.; Richard Cromwell, a junior from Stuart, Fla. and Steve Bowman, a senior from Tyler.

In tennis, coach David Kent's Aggie squad this week is ranked No. 16 in the nation among college tennis teams in a poll conducted by College and Junior Tennis Magazine and the

Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches Association.

The Southwest Conference tennis teams among the top 16. Arkansas was ranked No. 6, Houston State No. 7, Texas Tech No. 8, SMU in a tie for the No. 13 spot, TCU at No. 14 and the Aggies at 16.

This is Texas A&M's highest national tennis ranking ever in the first year the Aggies have ever been ranked in the nation's Top 20.

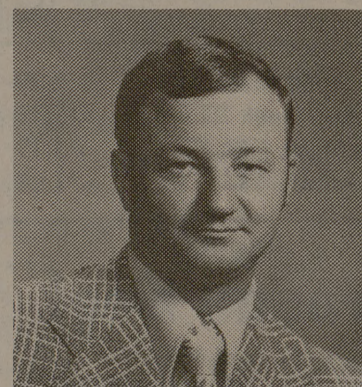

NEW YORK — New players finally found their way to the table as the baseball negotiations moved but a federal mediator is cautioning against hope for an easy end to their dispute.

Major league baseball owners, what could be a significant step in talks, Tuesday offered a proposal covering the two biggest issues in their dispute.

The offer softens the owners' position on free-agent compensation. The Ag also ups the pension offer. Major Miller, executive director of the Players Association, requested a hard study of the offer before resuming negotiations.

Ray Grebey, negotiator for the owners, indicated the talks would resume today.

Jim Sundberg replaced Jenkins and struck out Singleton but then hit Eddie Murray with a pitch. Graham followed with a single to left center to score Murray and Rivers scored when Murray failed to pick up the ball.

Singles by Al Bumbry, Kelly and Singleton's sacrifice fly gave Baltimore a 1-0 lead in the first half. Sundberg's fifth homer tied it in the third off Baltimore starter Steve Stone, 4-3. Tim Stoddard received the last out for his fifth save.
