

# Intramurals offer fun, competition for students

There will be several intramural activities offered this summer by the Texas A&M University Intramurals office.

The intramurals sports programs offer a variety of opportunities to all current students, faculty, staff and their spouses. There are competitive tournaments in six different sports, equipment check-out or rentals, and recreation facilities which include a fifty-meter outdoor pool, a jogging trail, racquetball courts, and more.

The competitive tournaments are designed so everyone can play regardless of ability. Each sport offers separate tournaments for those of high, medium, or simply recreational ability. Softball will offer a special Co-Rec league using a 16-inch softball. Other first summer session sports activities include three-man basketball, three-man volleyball, racquetball doubles, and tennis and handball singles. Team sports require a five dollar entry fee; other activities are free.

All participants must present their current student I.D. or TAMU Recreation I.D. at any sports event in which they play.

The policy of issuing TAMU Recreation I.D.s began in September, 1979. The policy requires all staff, faculty, and spouses of students, faculty, or staff to purchase a picture I.D. in order to participate in intramural activities, check out equipment, or use the facilities. The I.D. cards may be purchased for one dollar at the Intramurals Sports Office in DeWare Fieldhouse. Students, faculty, staff and their spouses (if they have I.D.s) may sponsor guests. A

guest pass may be obtained for one dollar a day. These may be purchased at the DeWare Check-out when facilities are open.

After 4 p.m., the recreational facilities are open for informal recreation. The indoor and outdoor facilities provide space for a wide variety of activities. Some special features are the free weight room, a 50-meter pool with diving platforms, and handball-racquetball courts. These courts, along with tennis courts, may be reserved at the Intramural Check-out at the DeWare Fieldhouse.

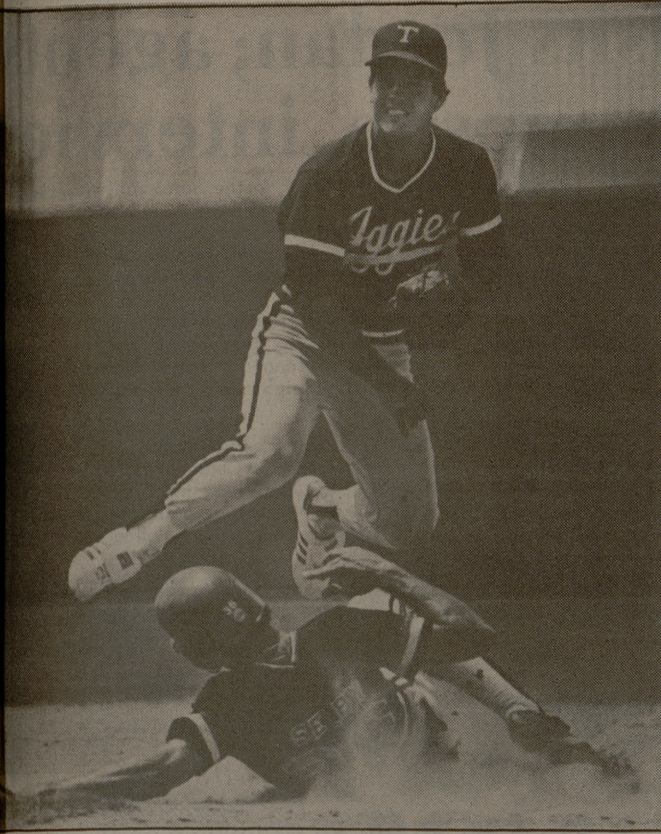
Those desiring to visit the pool during the summer sessions will be required to show an A&M I.D. or a photo pass (if not a student) to enter the pool area. For staff, faculty and their spouses, these passes may be obtained through the intramural office at DeWare.

Racquets may be rented, and handball and racquet sports balls purchased at the check-out room. Jogging maps for any distance from one mile to marathons are available free at the Intramural office. Hours for facility operations are also available.

Those looking for a summer job may be interested in officiating for basketball, softball and volleyball.

The base pay is \$3.10-per-game. Interested individuals should contact Dave Kerr at the Intramurals office. There will be an all-sports officials meeting today at 4 p.m. in Room 267, C. Rollie White.

## Astros, Ryan lose; Rangers rained out

Rick Wise and Eric Rasmussen combined on a four-hitter and Willie Montanez delivered a two-run single to highlight a three-run first inning Monday night, enabling the San Diego Padres to defeat Nolan Ryan and the Houston Astros, 3-0.

Meanwhile, in Chicago, the game between the Texas Rangers and the Chicago White Sox was called off because of rain and wet grounds Monday night with the score tied at 1-1 with one out in the last of the sixth inning.

In San Diego, Wise was forced out in the sixth inning when he pulled a rib cage muscle on the left side, but he got credit for the victory to even his record at 3-3. The 34-year-old righthander, appearing in his 300th National League game, gave up three hits before leaving.

Rasmussen took over and checked the Astros on one hit the remainder of the way to gain his first save.

The victory dropped Houston to third place, three games behind the National League Western Division-leading Los Angeles Dodgers, who defeated the Cincinnati Reds, 3-2 Monday.

The Chicago-Texas game will be replayed as part of a double-header Wednesday night.

Texas took a 1-0 lead in the first inning when Mickey Rivers doubled, went to third on a sacrifice by Bump Wills and scored on Al Oliver's infield out.

Texas starter Jon Matlack retired the first 10 men he faced before Alan Bannister lined a one-out single in the fourth. The White Sox tied it in the fifth when Lamar Johnson doubled and scored on Jim Morrison's single.
