Yarbrough wants to leave country

AUSTIN — Former Supreme Court Judge Donald B. Yarbrough, who faces a five-year prison sentence for lying to a grand jury investigating forgery allegations against him, wants permission to leave the country to attend medical school in the Caribbean.

Former Attorney General Waggoner Carr, Yarbrough's chief attorney, asked District Attorney Ronald Earle if he would oppose the move, and said he has not yet had a response from Earle.

Earle declined comment to the news media.

Yarbrough is free on bond while awaiting the outcome of the appeal of his conviction, and needs the approval of District Judge Mace Thurman to leave the country.

The judge said he had informed Carr that Yarbrough would have to file a written application for permission to leave the country.

Carr said the former jurist has been accepted into a medical school,

but said he did not know the name of the school.

"He's talked about it for months," Carr said. "Apparently he just got accepted. I asked the district attorney to see what their attitude would be."

Yarbrough, 38, was elected to the Supreme Court in 1976 in one of the state's major political surprises. Many political observers said Yarbrough's election was due to the similarity between his name and that of former governor candidate Don Yarborough, also of Houston.

He resigned from the court in July 1977 as the Legislature began proceedings to remove him from office, and in January 1978 was convicted of lying to the Travis County grand jury.

His appeal of that conviction has been pending in the Court of Criminal Appeals for almost 18 months, and may not be heard before the end of the year.

He voluntarily surrendered his license to practice law in Texas in the face of a disbarment suit.

Trip doesn't worry lone rower's parents

AUSTIN — Steve Kurachi plans to set out alone to row across the Atlantic Ocean this week and his parents say they are not going to worry about the perils of the 2,000-mile, 80-day trip.

Kurachi, 28, of Orem, Utah, telephoned his parents Wednesday from St. Johns, Newfoundland, where he plans to begin his voyage to Plymouth, England.

"We'll be thinking of him and praying for him," said his mother, Kumi Kurachi. "But I'm not worried. I honestly didn't worry about him last time."

The former Austin resident failed in a 1977 attempt to row a larger boat from North Carolina to England. That journey ended after seven weeks at sea when a storm cracked his fresh-water container and Kurachi radioed an SOS to a nearby ship.

Kurachi survived uninjured but his boat sank.

For today's voyage Kurachi built a 15-foot boat of fiberglass, polyurethane foam and plywood with built-in containers for 70 gallons

of fresh water.

"I hope he will make it this time," Mrs. Kurachi said. "Maybe he'll get it out of his system. It happens every spring, the birds go away and Steve wants to row across the ocean."

Kurachi named his boat the J, after his wife. The couple has five children.

Ousted TSU president to be replaced

HOUSTON — A Texas Southern University committee seeking a placement for ousted president Granville Sawyer has four top candidates, including a U.S. Department of Education official, TSU said Wednesday.

Among the reported candidates for the post is Dr. Leonard H. Spelman, 50, associate deputy commissioner for higher and continuing education in the Department of Education.

The others reportedly are Dr. Richard Trent, president of Medgar Evers College in New York; Dr. Ernest Boykins, president of Mississippi Valley State University in Bena, Miss.; and Dr. Clarence Mayberry, associate provost and academic planning at Colgate University in Hamilton, N.Y.

Search committee chairman, Dr. Regent Howard Kirven of Dallas said a new president will be named "very soon, in 10 days or possibly a week."

Dr. Everett Bell has been acting TSU president since Sawyer was fired by the board of regents in November.

Baytown conserving water

BAYTOWN — The city Water department began an emergency water conservation regimen because a pump motor failed at a second. The breakdown has cut off one-third of the city's supply.

City Manager Fritz Lanham said residents were prohibited indefinitely from using city water on lawns and gardens. Lanham said any violation could result in termination of service.

Officials said the shortage lowered water pressure in many households and caused problems in multi-story buildings. Baytown Medical Center used hand-carried containers and fire hydrants to flush upper level toilets.

"I don't know how soon we will have service back to normal," Lanham said. "It could happen tomorrow. We just don't know."

Officials said a contractor working on the sanded-in well expects the work to take two weeks. The second well motor burned out Monday and effort was underway to expedite repair.
