Ellenberger was suspended by UNM on Nov. 30, 1979, and later fired. He had been head coach at UNM since 1972 and was an assistant coach under Bob King five years prior to that. During his years as head coach, the Lobos compiled a record of 134-62 and won the WAC championship in 1974 and 1978. His 24-4 team of 1978 is consi-

dered his best and finished the season in fourth place in the final UPI national rankings. After that season he missed being named the National Coach of the Year by one vote in the balloting of the U.S. Basketball Wri-ters Association. He was named the District VII Coach of the Year.

Ellenberger is a native of New Haven, Ind., and played for Butler University.


