Financial aid now available

Summer is a good time to apply for financial aid, according to Steve Danz, director of The Scholarship Bank, a non-profit scholarship search service for students.

While many better-known financial aid programs have closed their doors for fall scholarships, The Scholarship Bank specializes in letting students know about lesser-known, private funding sources. These, Danz said, accept applications year-

round. The number of applications received during the summer is much less than the number received during the school year, making the competition much less intense.

applicants with up to fifty separate aid sources for which they are eligible. Danz said the average applicant receives 32 sources with a combined scholarship value of \$17,000. Many of those are renewable yearly, in-

creasing the value.

The Bank is also the only source for personalized graduate grant information, although their main business is undergraduate aid.

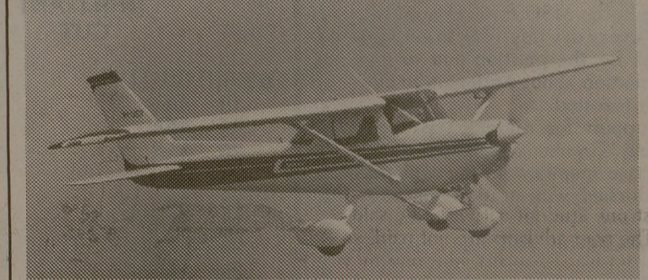

Silkwood roommate disappears

OKLAHOMA CITY — A Tuesday investigation of the disappearance of Sherrie Ellis, 24, had just completed a book of experiences with Karen Silkwood.

Ellis, who lived with Silkwood in November 1974 when both were radiation exposure at their arrival, was last seen Sunday, when she was to complete a manuscript book titled "Armed and Dangerous." A collaborator on the book, Clifton Warren, said friends determined the manuscript was last seen in the police spokesman Tom M... They said the woman's sister, Linda... reported her missing late Monday. The missing woman's pickup was found at her sister's residence. "We are investigating this as a missing person," M... said. "and we have to consider the possibility of foul play. But we don't have any evidence that would indicate foul play."

Warren said the "highly confidential" manuscript was the first to appear in the mail. The first was rejected by a publisher. Both Ellis and Silkwood worked at Kerr-McGee Nuclear Corp. near home City. Silkwood suffered radiation contamination, while Ellis suffered external exposure. In 1974, Kerr-McGee imported plutonium in Silkwood's apartment. A week later, she was killed in a traffic accident while delivering evidence to a reporter. Kerr-McGee's alleged worker negligence.
