



three-game series between the National League West leaders.

out bloop single in the ninth were the Astros' only hits. Sutcliffe, 2-4, struck out two, walked two and lowered his earned run average from 7.04 to 5.88.

Steve Garvey's bouncing single over the head of third baseman Enos Cabell to open the fifth inning was the first Dodger hit off starter and loser Joaquin Andujar, 0-3. One out later, Ron Cey walked and Bill Russell doubled to drive in Garvey with the first run. Steve Yeager walked to load the bases and Sutcliffe bounced his two-run single up the middle.
