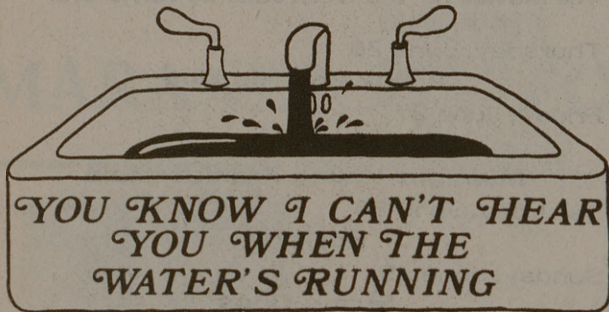

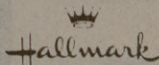

Howard and Perry only Aggies still competing in Eugene

And then there were two. Tim Scott became the latest Texas A&M University track casualty Wednesday night at the Olympic Trials in Eugene, Ore., when he failed to qualify for the shot put finals, and placed only eighth in the discus, not good enough to make the American team.

Wednesday afternoon, pole vaulter Randy Hall failed to leap the qualifying height of 17-2 1/4 in the second flight of the competition, and

was also eliminated. The biggest surprise of the day was the failure of Aggie trackster Leslie Kerr to show up for his second round heat. He had qualified for the final elimination heats on Tuesday with a fourth place 47.31 showing in his first heat, but failed to race Wednesday morning. Kerr was not available for comment.

Earlier in the week, Aggie hurdler Billy Busch was eliminated in a primary heat of the high hurdles.

The failure of Hall, Scott, Busch and Kerr to advance left only Chuck

Perry and Jim Howard to represent Texas A&M.

Howard and Perry will compete in the high jump heats on Saturday. In the discus, veteran Mac Perkins won the event with a throw of 225-4, and Scott took the eighth position with a throw of 196-8. He qualified for the finals with a 19.2 toss.

In the shot put, Scott finished 14th place — 13 qualified for the finals. He heaved the shot 61-4.

Although only the top 11 allowed to go to the finals, specialists made a special allowance Wednesday to allow Brian Oldfield to compete. Oldfield had won in order earlier in the day when he allowed him to compete. Oldfield has competed as a professional the past two years, and his amateur status was questioned by TAC and the USOC.

A last minute court injunction allowed him to compete, and placed for the finals to be held this morning. TAC and USOC may say they may appeal to a higher court.

SWC, ACC to share refs

United Press International GREENSBORO, N.C. — Southwest Conference and Atlantic Coast Conference basketball officials will work games in both leagues next season, says ACC Commissioner Bob C. James. Jimmy Earle, former head basketball coach at Middle Tennessee State, will be in charge of assigning officials, James said Wednesday. Earle is the executive director of the newly-organized Central Basketball Officiating Service Agency located in Murfreesboro, Tenn. "Earle will be responsible for training and assigning officials for all games in both the ACC and SWC and we will see an interchange of officials from these two areas of the country in most of our conference games," James said. "We also think that other major athletic conferences in this section of the United States will be part of this setup in the distant future."
