San Antonio enrolls aliens despite ruling

SAN ANTONIO — Preparations for the tuition-free enrollment of illegal alien children into public schools continued in San Antonio Wednesday despite an appeals court ruling granting a postponement in the procedure.

Tuesday, a three-judge panel of the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans granted the state of Texas' request for the delay, pending appeal of the case, which the court said it would consider later.

We will "proceed with our campaign to get as many of the undocumented aliens into schools as possible," said Margarita Huantes, chairman of the San Antonio Immigration Task Force.

Allen re-shapes Padre

Coastal damage assessed

CORPUS CHRISTI — Aerial photos indicate the brunt of Hurricane Allen smashed into the isolated coast between Corpus Christi and Brownsville, slicing 68 new cuts in popular Padre Island and changing its shape, a National Weather Service forecaster said Wednesday.

Dave Barnes, chief NWS forecaster in Louisiana, said "perhaps the most significant factor" in limiting loss of life in Texas was the fact the hurricane shifted right from its course for Brownsville, Texas.

Photos obtained by a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration research aircraft for the Miami Hurricane Center showed the most serious damage began just north of the developed part of Padre Island, he said.

"The photos show 68 brand new cuts across Padre Island, and it looks more like a series of short islands rather than the long continuous island that it was," said the forecaster.

Brownsville and this coastal city were extremely "lucky that the fury of the storm went in between the two populated areas," said Barnes, who said no one should doubt that "severe hurricane conditions" occurred on the Texas coast.

Two oil tankers aground because of the hurricane and a third ship, a freighter, were being worked on by the Coast Guard to set them free.

The tanker Mary Ellen, which was driven aground by the storm, was being unsuccessfully pulled by a tug in an effort to free it from Mustang Island. A second tug was sounding the bottom in the ship's path to make sure it could reach open water if it came free. The Mary Ellen was scheduled for offloading Thursday.

A barge on Matagorda Island was preparing to begin off-loading the grounded tanker Athenian to make it light enough to be pulled from a sand bar and the

freighter Argonaut also was being pulled on by an effort to free it.

Although Gov. Bill Clements Tuesday estimated the damage to Texas will total in excess of \$800 million, officials generally agreed the damage is less than feared as the monster storm approached from the

bean. A total of 272 people died, most of them remote, impoverished villages of Haiti.

The American Insurance Association's proper service estimated in Austin Wednesday non-flood damage to Texas will total \$42.4 million dollars.

The Texas Gulf coast, which lost millions to the 3, 1979 Ixtoc I oil spill, was cleaning up again, as time officials are more optimistic about the future tourism in the area. It took crews 10 months to clean up a runaway oil well that polluted Texas' sandy beaches.

Although the damage to some motels and hotels more direct this time, in the form of some broken down, downed phone lines, and a few flooded resort spokesmen say it was not extensive.

"It really hasn't hindered us at all," said Carl general manager of the Ramada Inn here. "We're with emergency repair people, telephone repair people, American Red Cross people, and so on."

Although guests are temporarily being turned away because of the cleanup and repair work, he said, "dollarwise and businesswise, we're doing about the same amount of business as the storm not come."

In Brownsville, a popular winter vacation spot, South Texas, Rachel Torres of the Chamber of Commerce, said the storm did "a great amount of damage to the lush palm trees and other island foliage, but expect tourism to quickly bounce back."
