Dave Barnes, chief NWS forecaster in Louisiana, said

perhaps the most significant factor" in limiting loss of life in Texas was the fact the hurricane shifted right from its course for Brownsville, Texas.

Photos obtained by a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration research aircraft for the Miami Hurricane Center showed the most serious damage began just north of the developed part of Padre Island, he

"The photos show 68 brand new cuts across Padre Island, and it looks more like a series of short islands rather than the long continuous island that it was," said

Brownsville and this coastal city were extremely "lucky that the fury of the storm went in between the two populated areas," said Barnes, who said no one should doubt that "severe hurricane conditions" occur-

The tanker Mary Ellen, which was driven aground by the storm, was being unsuccessfully pulled by a tug in an effort to free it from Mustang Island. A second tug was sounding the bottom in the ship's path to make sure it could reach open water if it came free. The Mary Ellen was scheduled for offloading Thursday.


