In Warsaw, the government pub-lished the first details of a proposed new set of price regulations designed to control the cost of living and ease workers complaints about inflation. The new regulations, which must be approved by Poland's Sejm (Par-

kes, 1,800 miners filed back to liament), would require government

permission for any increase in the price of 47 basic food items, including bread, meat, fish and vegetables and 56 industrial articles.

> The proposed list of controlled prices would include public trans-port fares, postage, rents and fees for services such as television repairs.

The Sejm will meet Friday. PAP said Premier Jozef Pinkowski will offer a program "for a fundamental remodeling of the government's work, with an eye to lead Poland out of the present difficult situation, re-move the sources of social discontent (and) bring the economy and public life back to normal.

In another measure aimed at con-trolling Poland's economic difficulties and consequent worker unrest, the government has been assembling a package of financial aid from the socialist countries of Eastern Europe, especially the Soviet Union.




