## Knee injury keeps him on the sidelines

Mississippi quarterback John Fourcade followed his blockers on the option to the strong side of the Aggie defense

Texas A&M safety John Dawson watched carefully and followed the ball. Out of the corner of his eye, he saw the Ole Miss split end curl around to block him. Dawson expected the end to hit him high, so he reached out to push him aside. Instead, the player hit him low, driving his helmet into Dawson's knee. It meant the end of the senior safety's 1980 season.

He was operated on a week later. 'I tried to move it (the knee) to the side to move away from the hit," he said Wednesday. "But it wasn't enough. He hit me smack on the knee. I never had that happen before; a player hit me like that.

Dawson is not a physically imposing character. His handsome face is decorated with a trimmed moustache and framed by short brown
