Ag in Germany finds it 'quaint'

A summer trip to Germany for studies abroad can provide more than just academic knowledge.
Gerd Smith, a 23-year-old senior in mechanical engineering, when he came back from his four-week course of studies in Rothenburg, Germany, during the summer of 1979, he had a greater appreciation of America and American lifestyles.

People in America don't realize it, Smith said, but there are creature comforts here that Americans take for granted.
For example, dishwashers, big iceboxes and complete bathing facilities, Smith said. The German family he stayed with while attending the Goethe Institute in Rothenburg for his studies of German language had a shower in their bathroom, he said, but they considered lucky by other Germans.

"People in Germany don't have big iceboxes," Smith said, "so they have to go shopping more often." And if anyone thinks prices are in America, he said, they should go to Europe and compare.
The town of Rothenburg was quaint, he said. A "medieval" preserved for tourists," Smith said it had a cobblestone street, a wall, and a barn downtown.

"Whew, did it smell, and right there in downtown," he said. Smith said every morning when he went to school he would see shopkeepers sweeping their porches to get rid of the barn's other products.
This was because of the lack of zoning laws in Germany, he said. Another thing Americans should appreciate.

Germans have a positive attitude toward Americans, Smith said. Few American students had any language communication problems. Those that did, he said, practiced the false belief that if you talk enough, the Germans will understand you — regardless of what you are speaking the German language or not.
Smith said the main staples of German food are bread, beer, sausage.

Studies were not the only thing given by this Texas A&M University sponsored program. There were also two weeks of fun. Smith said. During that time the group of 15 students toured the countryside, saw castles and the Black Forest. German cities also have McDonald's pizza, discos and parties.

Endowment soliciting funds

A campaign is underway at Texas A&M University to raise \$20,000 to establish an endowment for chemistry students.

The proposed Arthur E. Martell Graduate Student Enrichment Fund is named for the professor of chemistry who headed the department from 1966 until his retirement this year. Martell's leadership has been credited with taking the Texas A&M

chemistry program "from obscurity to one of national prominence which is almost unparalleled among U.S. chemistry departments," a recent committee report said.
At least \$20,000 in donations is required to make the endowment perpetual, fund organizers said.

Awards from the fund will be made on an individual basis to committee consisting of faculty, graduate students, Dr. Al Clearfield, professor of chemistry.
"It is hoped that the faculty students and friends of Dr. Martell will be able to contribute to the fund-raising efforts," Clearfield said.
He said all donations are deductible and may be sent to the chemistry department. Information is available by calling 3834.
