## Jobs at museum; Lo sleep required

DALLAS — This is a dream job. Literally. It's a highly special position for those who have trouble staying awake on the job.

The major requirements are that you be able to sleep between 5 and 5 p.m. and not be too shy to slumber in front of a crowd.

Robin Sachs, director of public relations at the Dallas Health Science Museum, is looking for the sleepers for a unique multi-media portrait of a sleeper.

Sachs said applicants should not be taking drugs and be interested in the process of dreaming. The museum will pay, through a grant from the Hoffman LaRoche pharmaceutical firm, \$150 a week for people to sleep in a public exhibit in the museum. Museum patrons will have opportunity to observe the human body at rest and, by electron attached to the sleepers, to witness patterns of brain activity during sleep and dreaming.

The exhibit is called "Dreamstage — An Experimental Portrait of the Sleeping Brain" and will run from Nov. 15 through Feb. 1, 1981. The exhibit is primarily the work of Dr. Allan Hobson, head of psychiatry at Harvard Medical School and a leading dream and sleep researcher, Sachs said. Previous exhibits were held in Boston and Seattle.

Also involved in the presentation of the exhibit are Ted Spurgeon, a photographer involved in time-lapse photography of the ballet of Paul Earls, a laser scientist, and Bagnild Karlstrom, an artist of natural landscapes — pictures drawn from cell and brain activity.

"It is really more of an educational exhibit than an experiential one," Sachs said.

The museum will divide the exhibit into two sections, one light and one dark. In the light section will be conventional presentations of sleep theories and dream research, she said. The dark section will be a black room, the center of which will contain a dimly lit one-way sleeping chamber.

"We will have black throw pillows for people to relax on and we will have dream experiences we have compiled," she said.

Electrodes attached to the sleeper will give a constant monitoring of rapid eye movement — the period of sleep when dreams occur — and other physiological activities. Brain signals through the electrodes will be translated and projected by colored laser beams for the different levels of sleep. Finally, Sachs said, the electrodes will be hooked up to trigger different musical notes, producing a symphony of sleep to accompany the physical ballet.

How has the response to the museum's small classified ad in the Dallas Morning News seeking sleep participants?

"It has been going very, very well. We have about 350 applicants for the six to eight positions," she said.

## New rail act may produce higher Texas utility bills

AUSTIN — Railroad Commissioner Jim Nugent said today the Rail Act of 1980 approved Wednesday by Congress will allow railroads to make almost unchecked increases in the rates charged Texas utility companies for hauling coal from Wyoming and Montana to Texas.

"More and more, coal is firing the boilers in the state's electrical plants," Nugent told a news conference.

"As the cost of moving that coal increases without reasonable limits or review, so too will your utility bill. And we have no choice in the matter. Federal law and rising costs require that we stop using natural gas as a boiler fuel."

Nugent said Burlington Northern's "furious rising rates" for hauling coal to San Antonio have attracted considerable public attention, but he said at least six Texas utilities serving more than 130 counties are receiving coal from Colorado, Wyoming and Montana.

"Under the Staggers Act, the roads will increase rates more with fewer opportunities to protest and appeal them," he said. "I'm confident that the impact on these electricity markets will be into tens of millions of dollars in this decade."

Nugent said the Railroad Commission has the option of accepting ratification to administer the law within Texas, or to leave that administration to the Interstate Commerce Commission.

"If we are to be reduced to runners for the ICC, I have doubts about the continuing of state rail regulation," he said. "Railroad Commission was established in the last century to end the kind of rate discrimination shipper preference that this opens the door to."

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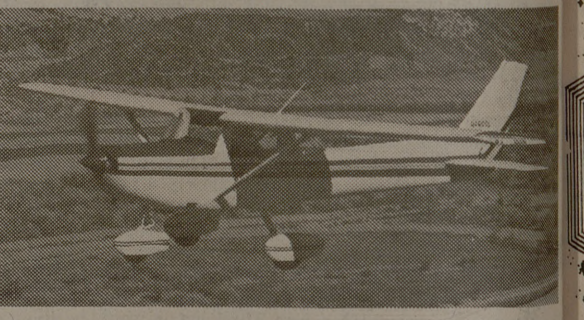
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
