United Press International DEADWOOD, S.D. — Padlocks rdered by a federal judge barred he doors to Deadwood's infamous brothels Tuesday. Some claimed it was a long overdue victory for law and order, but there was little joy at Wild Bill Hickock's old hangout. Brothels have been a part of Deadod's colorful history since the gold ash era and openly operated in the own's downtown tourist area in de-lance of state law.

But Circuit Judge Roy E. Brandenburg issued a permanent injunc-

tion Monday against three bawdy houses following a three-hour hearing on a civil complaint filed by the state. A similar hearing is scheduled

for Thursday against a fourth house. "I think it's fantastic and is supportive of a community effort, Karen Saxer, who gathered 350 signatures on petitions asking that the houses of prostitution be closed.

"We care enough about this city to try to uphold the law." But there was no cheering at the Old Style No. 10, a bar named after the Deadwood saloon where Wild

Bill Hickok was shot to death Aug. 2,

'I think it's a stupid decision, and I've lived here all my life," said Lin-da Ford, who works at the Old Style No. 10. "I honestly don't think they

ever bothered anyone."

The judge had granted the state's request for a preliminary injunction in June, but the houses actually had been closed since a May raid by state, federal and local authorities. A federal grand jury, which convened following the raid, failed to return

"Obviously the judge is following what the law clearly makes illegal, Lawrence County State's Attorney Craig Grotenhouse said. "Whether it is a victory for the community of Deadwood, I don't know that. Deadwood is going to have to look at itself

in the future. A worker at the Franklin Hotel, located below some of the brothels said, "I think they should be open. They weren't doing anybody any harm, not in no way, shape or

Congressman warns paper that use of ad will libel him

DES MOINES, Iowa — Rep. Tom Harkin, D-Iowa,
warned 85 southwest Iowa newspapers they may be
dragged into a libel suit if they publish a paid advertisement critical of him, the Des Moines Register said

The copyright story said Harkin claims the advertisement, called "The Hypocrisy of Tom Harkin," is being placed in the newspapers by the John Birch Society.

Harkin's letter to the newspapers, marked "not for

ublication," was not a threat, the congressman said, but an attempt to notify the papers they could become involved in a lawsuit he plans to file against the group that placed the ad.

Plant leaks gas again, no danger

necticut Yankee nuclear power plant released a small amount of radioactive gas into the atmosphere for six minutes Tuesday, the second such release in less than two weeks, offi-

Northeast Utilities spokesman Everett Perkins said the "very small, unplanned radioactive release" occurred at the plant at 4:20 a.m. He said the release did not exceed any federal limits and posed no danger to

Perkins said the release was re-ported to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and state and local officials because it was unplanned.

On Sept. 26 Connecticut Yankee leaked radioactive gas into the atmosphere for more than three mi-Northeast, which operates the state's three nuclear power plants,

said the earlier release was caused by a technician who accidently opened the wrong valve. Perkins said engineers were trying to determine how Tuesday's release occurred and exactly how much gas

eaked into the atmosphere. He said the maximum dose of radioactivity at the plant boundary measured .003 millirems. The average annual dose of radioactivity received in the area from naturally occurring sources of radiation in the area is 55 millirems, he said.

"There would be no danger to the public," Perkins said.

No acquittal of FBI chiefs for break-ins

United Press International WASHINGTON — A federal udge, rejecting defense arguments that prosecutors had failed to prove their case, refused Tuesday to order the acquittal of two former FBI chiefs charged with approving illegal

Lawyers for former FBI No. 2 man W. Mark Felt and retired bureau intelligence chief Edward S. Miller now are likely to call a parade of defense witnesses for testimony that ould extend four weeks or m

In arguing for acquittal after 13 days of prosecution testimony, defense lawyer Thomas Kennelly contended the break-ins in 1972 and 1973 were part of a legitimate national security investigation — a hunt for fugitive radicals.

But chief U.S. District Judge William Bryant said: "Suppose I had three children, and suppose during a particular political situation ... my children break away and join a radical group.

Are you telling me somebody has right to sneak in my house and go through my effects?"

Strip mining rules OK'd in two states

United Press International WASHINGTON — Interior Secretary Cecil Andrus Tuesday approved coal strip mining regulations proposed by Maryland and Louisiana but rejected parts of the reclamation programs submitted by Virginia and West Virginia.

Andrus said the failure of Virginia and West Virginia to have their entire programs accepted would not affect interim federal surface mining grants or impose new obligations on coal operators.

"Both these critically important coal states have made great strides in achieving primacy and we have every belief they will be successful upon final review in January," said Andrus.

He said his agency would work very closely with the two states to help them pass muster. Virginia and West Virginia have 60 days to rese mit their programs to Andrus.
